#### CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION OF SINS

FIRST LESSON HOSEA 6: 1-6

The prophet is condemning the people's false attitude of basically thinking they could do whatever they wanted, and then go get God's forgiveness at the temple. The modern day thought is "It's easier to ask for forgiveness, than to ask for permission." Is that good or right? Hosea calls them on this with some pointed imagery by teaching them what faithfulness looks like, with the faithful Word of the LORD. Interesting that the Bible records Jesus quoting this section twice in His ministry!

1 Come, and let us return to the LORD; For He has torn, but He will heal us; He has stricken, but He will bind us up. 2 After two days He will revive us; On the third day He will raise us up, That we may live in His sight. 3 Let us know, Let us pursue the knowledge of the LORD. His going forth is established as the morning; He will come to us like the rain, Like the latter and former rain to the earth. 4 " O Ephraim, what shall I do to you? O Judah, what shall I do to you? For your faithfulness is like a morning cloud, And like the early dew it goes away. 5 Therefore I have hewn them by the prophets, I have slain them by the words of My mouth; And your judgments are like light that goes forth. 6 For I desire mercy and not sacrifice, And the knowledge of God more than burnt offerings.

#### PSALM OF THE DAY

PSALM 123: 1-3

We need mercy from our Lord. His ways our higher than ours. We depend on God's mercy daily; so look for God's mercy like your are looking forward to your paycheck. It is our treasure that literally leads out of this world. His mercy is the only answer to our sin problem. His mercy removes our sin, our guilt, and brings healing to our souls.

SECOND LESSON MARK 2: 23-28

Jesus is Lord of the Sabbath. There were preconceived ideas in Jesus' day about the attitude toward the rules and regulations of the Sabbath (that the LORD had indeed commanded). Jesus knew they respected David, but they were not respecting "David's greater Son..." the Christ. Because the Pharisees were so wrapped up attempting to keep the Sabbath perfectly, they missed the reason for the Sabbath in the first place... God bringing peace to our souls!

23 Now it happened that He went through the grainfields on the Sabbath; and as they went His disciples began to pluck the heads of grain. 24 And the Pharisees said to Him, "Look, why do they do what is not lawful on the Sabbath?" 25 But He said to them, "Have you never read what David did when he was in need and hungry, he and those with him: 26 "how he went into the house of God in the days of Abiathar the high priest, and ate the showbread, which is not lawful to eat, except for the priests, and also gave some to those who were with him?" 27 And He said to them, "The Sabbath was made for man, and not man for the Sabbath. 28 "Therefore the Son of Man is also Lord of the Sabbath."

P: Blessed are they who hear the Word of God and keep it.

C: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

These words are written that we may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

THE ELDER,

To the elect lady and her children, whom I love in truth, and not only I, but also all those who have known the truth,

2 because of the truth which abides in us and will be with us forever:

**3** Grace, mercy, and peace will be with you from God the Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of the Father, in truth and love.

4 I rejoiced greatly that I have found some of your children walking in truth, as we received commandment from the Father. 5 And now I plead with you, lady, not as though I wrote a new commandment to you, but that which we have had from the beginning: that we love one another. 6 This is love, that we walk according to His commandments. He who abides in the doctrine of Christ has both the Father and the Son. 10 If anyone comes to you and does not bring this doctrine, do not receive him into your house nor greet him; 11 for he who greets him shares in his evil deeds.

12 Having many things to write to you, I did not wish to do so with paper and ink; but I hope to come to you and speak face to face, that our joy may be full.

13 The children of your elect sister greet you. Amen.

**CLC – WELS – ELS Discussions.** On August 1, representatives of the CLC, the WELS, and the ELS met at Bethany Seminary in Mankato to continue our discussions about matters that have separated our synods for many years. The first part of the meeting centered on the recent events at the 2018 CLC Convention. The men from the WELS and ELS expressed their disappointment that the CLC had not adopted the 2015 Joint Statement Regarding the Termination of Fellowship. The CLC men relayed our Convention resolutions, which stated:

- The Joint Statement is a scripturally sound presentation of doctrinal principles.
- It does not resolve all the issues involving the doctrine of church fellowship that have separated us.
- At the same time, the CLC Convention did not reject the Joint Statement, and we are aiming for a final disposition of this document at our 2020 Convention.
- We are thankful for the progress that has been made over the past several years of inter-synodical discussions.
- There are issues other than the doctrine of church fellowship that separate us.
- It is our heartfelt desire to work toward a restoration of God-pleasing fellowship with the ELS and WELS based upon a unity of doctrine and practice.
- We hope that our talks with the ELS and WELS can continue.

The second part of our meeting was taken up with a discussion of the topic of In Statu Confessionis, or "protesting fellowship." Historically, this phrase has been used as a protest against doctrinal error within a church body in an attempt to drive it out. It has sometimes been wrongly used as a justification to continue in fellowship with known false teachers. The history of its use by the WELS and ELS over toward the LC-MS was discussed. Additionally, we talked about its use in connection with the European church bodies which remained in fellowship with both the LC-MS and WELS/ELS for many years following the breakup of the Synodical Conference. The representatives of the WELS and ELS stated that it is their conviction that In Statu Confessionis is to be used only with weak brethren, and not with those identified as false teaching church bodies. In the course of this discussion, we revisited the reasons why the founders of the CLC found it necessary to leave their former fellowships in the WELS and ELS.

The future of our inter-synodical discussions was left in doubt. All agreed that it might be profitable to meet again following the 2019 CLC General Pastoral Conference next summer. It will be up to the respective synod presidents as to whether this meeting will take place. Meanwhile, our 3-man committee hopes to provide further information for next summer's General Pastoral Conference to consider, through continuing correspondence with the WELS and ELS.
