OLD TESTAMENT READING

GENESIS 22: 1-14

Now it came to pass after these things that God tested Abraham, and said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." 2 Then He said, "Take now your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you." 3 So Abraham rose early in the morning and saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and Isaac his son; and he split the wood for the burnt offering, and arose and went to the place of which God had told him. 4 Then on the third day Abraham lifted his eyes and saw the place afar off. 5 And Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; the lad and I will go yonder and worship, and we will come back to you." 6 So Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on Isaac his son; and he took the fire in his hand, and a knife, and the two of them went together. 7 But Isaac spoke to Abraham his father and said, "My father!" And he said, "Here I am, my son." Then he said, "Look, the fire and the wood, but where is the lamb for a burnt offering? 8 And Abraham

said, "My son, God will provide for Himself the lamb for a burnt offering." So the two of them went together. 9 Then they came to the place of which God had told him. And Abraham built an altar there and placed the wood in order; and he bound Isaac his son and laid him on the altar, upon the wood. 10 And Abraham stretched out his hand and took the knife to slay his son. 11 But the Angel of the LORD called to him from heaven and said, "Abraham, Abraham!" So he said, "Here I am." 12 And He said, "Do not lay your hand on the lad, or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from Me." 13 Then Abraham lifted his eyes and looked, and there behind him was a ram caught in a thicket by its horns. So Abraham went and took the ram, and offered it up for a burnt offering instead of his son. 14 And Abraham called the name of the place, The-LORD-Will-Provide; as it is said to this day, "In the Mount of The LORD it shall be provided."

OPPORTUNITY TO SUPPORT CLC MISSION HELPER TRIP

Dear Members of Immanuel Lutheran Church, God has opened a door of opportunity for me to be a part of the CLC Mission Helper Trip this coming summer. The 2019 trip was set for three weeks this summer in India to work with the members of the Church of the Lutheran Confession of India and the Berea Ev. Lutheran Church. However, with growing hostility and persecution towards Christians in that area, the other volunteers and I were faced with a difficult decision as to whether it was now safe for us to travel there. After much prayer and consideration, the CLC Board of Missions has put in motion a new Mission Helper trip to East Africa. I ask that you keep the families of India in your prayers, and that we may be able to send a mission group there in the future.

It is truly a blessing that the Lord has given us a new opportunity to visit the people of Zambia and Tanzania. If the Lord continues to bless our efforts I, along with the other CLC Mission Helper Volunteers, will have the opportunity to proclaim the Gospel to many, many children. Some of these children are already members of our sister congregations, but many of the children we will reach have never truly heard of their Savior Jesus. We will be traveling to different villages where a CLC affiliated congregation is located. In each village we will teach a series of Bible stories that serve to proclaim both the Law and Gospel. These lessons will also include a craft that will reinforce the message. I am very excited to use my God given talents to help spread the word in East Africa!

I am asking for your prayers on behalf of myself, the other volunteers, those with whom I will be working, and the many lost souls who will be reached with the Gospel. As you can well imagine, the financial cost of such service to the Lord is rather large. The cost of the trip is approximately \$3,000 - \$3,500. I am also asking for your assistance to help me cover part of the cost for this trip. Any amount you are able to give will be greatly appreciated and put to good use in the Lord's Kingdom. My initial down payment of \$2000 to cover the cost of airfare and other trip expenses will be sent in to the Mission Helper Program by March 5. Thank you for your consideration. THE SEASON OF LENT begins on Ash Wednesday (March 6 this year). Lent culminates with the death of Jesus on Good Friday (April 19) and closes with the celebration of Jesus' resurrection on Easter morning (April 21). Since the very earliest years of the Church, Christians have celebrated the resurrection of Jesus. In 325 AD, at the Council of Nicea, a firm date was established for the annual celebration of this important festival. Already during these early centuries, Christians prepared for the Easter celebration with a period of repentance called Lent (an Anglo-Saxon word meaning "spring"). In the 700's AD, this period of time was set at 40 days (not including Sundays) based on the 40 days Jesus was tempted in the wilderness at the start of His ministry.

While the commemoration of Lent is not commanded in Scripture, and is also abused and misused by some, it can be a beneficial time for spiritual reflection through the study of God's Word as we focus on the redemption won for us by our Savior through His suffering and death on the cross.

Jesus, may our hearts be burning with more fervent love for Thee! May our eyes be ever turning to Thy cross of agony Till in glory, parted never from the blessed Savior's side, Graven in our hearts forever, dwell the cross, the Crucified! TLH 145:3
