#### OLD TESTAMENT READING

#### EXODUS 16: 2-16

When we are not content it is an attack against God. It also drives us to desire foolish things (like wanting to return to Egypt!). We often take our frustration out on others around us (like Moses and Aaron). Are we any different? Not at all. But God still provides food for His people in the wilderness through manna and quail. And God shows His mercy to us as well. The repeated nature of God's mercy on Israel and us shows His love and power.

Then the whole congregation of the children of Israel complained against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness. **3** And the children of Israel said to them, "Oh, that we had died by the hand of the LORD in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the pots of meat and when we ate bread to the full! For you have brought us out into this wilderness to kill this whole assembly with hunger." **4** Then the LORD said to Moses, "Behold, I will rain bread from heaven for you. And the people shall go out and gather a certain quota every day, that I may test them, whether they will walk in My law or not.

**5** "And it shall be on the sixth day that they shall prepare what they bring in, and it shall be twice as much as they gather daily." **6** Then Moses and Aaron said to all the children of Israel, "At evening you shall know that the LORD has brought you out of the land of Egypt. **7** "And in the morning you shall see the glory of the LORD; for He hears your complaints against the LORD. But what are we, that you complain against us?" **8** Also Moses said, "This shall be seen when the LORD gives you meat to eat in the evening, and in the morning bread to the full; for the LORD hears your complaints which you make against Him. And what are we? Your complaints are not

against us but against the LORD." 9 Then Moses spoke to Aaron, "Say to all the congregation of the children of Israel, 'Come near before the LORD, for He has heard your complaints." 10 Now it came to pass, as Aaron spoke to the whole congregation of the children of Israel, that they looked toward the wilderness, and behold, the glory of the LORD appeared in the cloud. **11** And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, **12** "I have heard the complaints of the children of Israel. Speak to them, saying, 'At twilight you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall be filled with bread. And you shall know that I am the LORD your God." 13 So it was that quails came up at evening and covered the camp, and in the morning the dew lay all around the camp. 14 And when the layer of dew lifted, there, on the surface of the wilderness, was a small round substance, as fine as frost on the ground. 15 So when the children of Israel saw it, they said to one another, "What is it?" For they did not know what it was. And Moses said to them, "This is the bread which the LORD has given you to eat. 16 "This is the thing which the LORD has commanded: 'Let every man gather it according to each one's need, one omer for each person, according to the number of persons; let every man take for those who are in his tent."

#### **GOSPEL READING**

JOHN 6: 1-15

Jesus uses the need of the people as a teaching opportunity, but the disciples miss the point of what Jesus is going to do. Jesus provides for all the people using just a small amount of food. There is even more left over than what they begin with! The response of the people is both good and bad. They confess that Jesus is The Prophet foretold, but want to make Him their physical, earthly king.

After these things Jesus went over the Sea of Galilee, which is the Sea of Tiberias. **2** Then a great multitude followed Him, because they saw His signs which He performed on those who were diseased. **3** And Jesus went up on the mountain, and there He sat with His disciples. **4** Now the Passover, a feast of the Jews, was near. **5** Then

Jesus lifted up His eyes, and seeing a great multitude coming toward Him, He said to Philip, "Where shall we buy bread, that these may eat?" 6 But this He said to test him, for He Himself knew what He would do. 7 Philip answered Him, "Two hundred denarii worth of bread is not sufficient for them, that every one of them may have a little." 8 One of His disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to Him, 9 "There is a lad here who has five barley loaves and two small fish, but what are they among so many?" **10** Then Jesus said. "Make the people sit down." Now there was much grass in the place. So the men sat down, in number about five thousand, **11** And Jesus took the loaves, and when He had given thanks, He distributed them to the disciples, and the disciples to those sitting down; and likewise of the fish, as much as they wanted. 12 So when they were filled, He said to His disciples, "Gather up the fragments that remain, so that nothing is lost." 13 Therefore they gathered them up, and filled twelve baskets with the fragments of the five barley loaves which were left over by those who had eaten. 14 Then those men, when they had seen the sign that Jesus did, said, "This is truly the Prophet who is to come into the world." 15 Therefore when Jesus perceived that they were about to come and take Him by force to make Him king, He departed again to the mountain by Himself alone.

- **P:** Blessed are they who hear the Word of God and keep it.

Tell me, you who desire to be under the law, do you not hear the law? 22 For it is written that Abraham had two sons: the one by a bondwoman, the other by a freewoman. 23 But he who was of the bondwoman was born according to the flesh, and he of the freewoman through promise, 24 which things are symbolic. #### Did you know?

Offerings specifically designated to "School Student Aid" provide tuition scholarships for students wishing to attend Immanuel Lutheran School. Families with students in our school pay tuition. At times, families have difficulty meeting the tuition costs for their children. It is our prayer that any student wishing to attend our school will be able to do so without financial hardship.

From the Board of Finance: The first months of 2019 were challenging for consistent church attendance--bad roads, cancelled services, cold, .... This is a larger deficit than the same time last year, a year with a very large deficit in November/December (which the Lord graciously moved us to overcome).
