As our Good Shepherd, Jesus is invested and dedicated to the care and preservation of His sheep. During the season of Lent we have seen this dedication to God's plan of salvation and His willingness to lay down His life for our salvation. He is unlike the so-called "shepherd" of our world that promise but don't deliver. Jesus does deliver, by both dying and rising again to accomplish salvation for every sinner.

11 "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd gives His life for the sheep. 12 "But a hireling, he who is not the shepherd, one who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees; and the wolf catches the sheep and scatters them. 13 "The hireling flees because he is a hireling and does not care about the sheep. 14 "I am the good shepherd; and I know My sheep, and am known by My own. 15 "As the Father knows Me, even so I know the Father; and I lay down My life for the sheep. 16 "And other sheep I have which are not of this fold; them also I must bring, and they will hear My voice; and there will be one flock and one shepherd.

OLD TESTAMENT READING

The LORD uses the illustration of sheep and a shepherd to describe His relationship with His people and what He would do for them. They were in captivity in Babylon, scattered throughout the nations, but the LORD would gather them and lead them back to the land of promise. This has a double fulfillment as it also pictures the LORD's promise to gather believers on the last day and bring them to heaven.

11 `For thus says the Lord GOD: "Indeed I Myself will search for My sheep and seek them out. 12 "As a shepherd seeks out his flock on the day he is among his scattered sheep, so will I seek out My sheep and deliver them from all the places where they were scattered on a

cloudy and dark day. 13 "And I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries, and will bring them to their own land; I will feed them on the mountains of Israel, in the valleys and in all the inhabited places of the country. 14 "I will feed them in good pasture, and their fold shall be on the high mountains of Israel. THE INSTITUTION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

- P: Holy Communion is called the Lord's Supper, the Lord's Table, and the Sacrament of the Altar. What is the Sacrament of the Altar?

 1 Cor. 11:20; 10:21; 11:24
- ALL: It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, given to us Christians under the bread and wine to eat and to drink, as it was instituted by Christ Himself.
 - What is this bread? Christ's body risen from the dead: This bread we break, This life we take, Was crushed to pay for our release. Oh, taste and see - the Lord is peace.

Tan Hymnal 755 (v. 1)

P: But where is this written?

ALL: The holy evangelists Matthew, Mark, Luke, and the apostle Paul write this way:

P: "Our Lord Jesus Christ, the same night in which He was betrayed, took bread; and, when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to His disciples saying, 'Take, eat. This is My body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of Me.'

- ALL: In the same way He took the cup, after supper, gave thanks, and gave it to them saying,
- P: 'Drink of it, all of you. This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.'"
- What is this wine? The blood of Jesus shed for mine; The cup of grace, Brings His embrace, Of life and love, and so I sing: Oh taste and see - The Lord is King.

THE BLESSINGS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

P: What is the benefit of this eating and drinking?

ALL: The words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," show us that God gives forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation through the Sacrament.

P: For where there is forgiveness of sins,

ALL: There is also life and salvation!

So who am I, That I should live and He should die, Under the rod. My God, my God, Why have You not forsaken me? Oh taste and see - the Lord is free.

THE POWER OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

- **P:** How can eating and drinking do such wonderful things?
- ALL: Eating and drinking actually do nothing. It is the words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins" which do this.
- **P:** These words, together with the bodily eating and drinking, are the main part of the Sacrament.
- ALL: Whoever believes these words has exactly what they say: forgiveness of sins.
- Yet is God here? Oh, yes! By Word and promise clear. In mouth and soul, He makes us whole Christ, truly present in this meal. Oh, taste and see the Lord is real.

THE RECEPTION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

P: When is one properly prepared to receive this Sacrament?

ALL: Customs in connection with eating and clothing are indeed a fine preparation.

- **P:** However, a person is truly worthy and well-prepared who has faith in these words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins."
- ALL: Whoever does not believe these words or doubts them is unworthy and unprepared. The words, "for you," require nothing but believing hearts.
- Is this for me? I am forgiven and set free! I do believe, That I receive, His very body and His blood. Oh, taste and see the Lord is good.

DISTRIBUTION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Our Practice of Close Communion Holy Communion is rightly called a 'Sacrament' because it is a "Sacred act;" not in what WE do for Christ, but in what Christ does for US! Because God's Word presents the reception of this Sacrament as a most intimate expression of spiritual and confessional unity (1 Corinthians 1:10; 10:16-17 Romans 16:17-18), we ask only those who have publicly professed such oneness of faith and belief with us by membership with us here or another CLC church come forward at this time. This is not a judgment of anyone's faith, but rather an expression of ours. Please speak with a pastor if you are seeking a church home or have any questions. We'd love to have you!

Communing Members who have difficulty at the kneeling rail may sit in the front pew on either side. The pastors will bring communion to you there. Any communicants sitting in the balcony should please come down to the narthex for direction to the table. Communicants are ushered to the communion table. If you desire the bread in your hand, simply extend your hand to the Pastor as he approaches you with the bread. Those desiring an individual cup, please take a cup when the tray is offered. The common cup will immediately follow. Please dispose of your individual cup in the baskets located behind each pillar or in the center aisle. **See page 11.**


