# Remembering our Veterans this Memorial Day Weekend

In late January of 1943, the Heavy Cruiser USS Chicago was escorting convoys to Guadalcanal. The battle for Guadalcanal would go down in history as one of the longest, more intense battles in World War II. Stationed on the Cruiser was our very own Immanuel member Marty Krueger. From Pearl Harbor to that day in January on the Chicago, he had already been in harm's way many times. In the battle of Coral Sea in 1942, they were supporting the big Aircraft Carrier, Yorktown. The Rennelle Battle started early in the morning. The cruiser took two torpedo hits from Japanese torpedo planes. The ship itself was lit up in the early morning light from two downed Japanese planes in the water. The next day, while it was in for repair, the Japanese reappeared resulting in four more torpedo hits. The Cruiser sank in twenty minutes. On that ship alone, 62 souls were killed and 1,049 were rescued including Marty. I asked Marty about it once and his answer was, "Thank goodness I knew how to swim." On this Memorial Day, we remember Marty and another World War II Navy veteran, Harold Wolle. Thank Harold and Marty for their courageous service for us and for the United States of America.
