BREAKING DOWN WALLS?

Brief recap from our "Marriage Built to Last" class this past week

Have you ever had a car breakdown at the most inconvenient time? So how did you react? What was the problem? How did you get it fixed? Regular maintenance of a car is like the regular maintenance needed in a marriage. What barriers do you face? How do you keep your marriage fueled and tuned up and ready to roll with the ups and downs of life?

What kind of BARRIERS come between relationships?

In our video, we heard about several types of barriers:

- **1. Personality Barriers:** One area that can be difficult is with an individual's personal priorities. Maybe your career, children, hobbies, or normal day to day life doesn't make room for your spouse. Maybe your spouse is an introvert and you're an extrovert (or vice versa). Maybe your discipline styles are totally different. These personality barriers can build up walls not just subtly, but quickly in a marriage!
- **2. Gender Barriers:** There is a big difference in how we communicate based on our gender (as we've briefly mentioned in the past). One may think bigger picture while the other is more focused on the details. What is your love language? What is your spouse's? Are you missing each other in communication? How are your roles and responsibilities as a man or woman viewed? Overbearing male? Emasculating wife?
- **3. Spiritual Barriers:** Our emotional baggage and outright sinful natures are one of the biggest reasons we build up walls against one another in a marriage or other relationships. Think of the bitter walls we build over days or even years of resentment, or the jealousy towers we look down from, or thick stubborn walls with a foundation of unforgiveness. Truly, Christ's love can break through these sinful, emotional structures!
- **4. Historical Barriers:** We bring a lot of baggage from our past as well into our relationship. Past insecurities. Feelings of acceptance or not with in-laws. Or past walls and barriers built from emotional, sexual, or physical abuse can all be a part of the barriers that come between a marriage.

So how can we begin to break these barriers?

1. The fuel of commitment.

Think of Jesus' commitment to you. Marriage is a lifelong choice of unconditional love, just like Jesus' love towards you. Love is giving another person what they need most but deserve the least. Let your conduct be without covetousness; be content with such things as you have. For He Himself has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." (Heb. 13:5 NKJ)

2. The oil of communicating.

When a car gets heated up, you don't let it overheat and boil over. The same thing is true of a marriage. Sex, money, and in-laws all may cause friction, but you break down walls by asking your spouse questions like, What are your concerns? What are your desires or wishes? What are you willing to do? "But, speaking the truth in love, may grow up in all things into Him who is the head-- Christ-- from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by what every joint supplies, according to the effective working by which every part does its share, causes growth of the body for the edifying of itself in love." (Eph. 4:15-16 NKJ)

3. The tune-up of caring.

Every marriage needs this too. It's the regular maintenance of building that fun, joy, and friendship back into the relationship from early dating. It's showing the attention, interest and priority to your spouse (and continuing to seek and learn how to work on it). "Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself." (Phil. 2:3 NKJ)

4. The navigational system of commission.

Marriages need goals. What are you working on <u>together</u>? How are you using your gifts for the Lord, and for each other? What time are you lining up with Christ together? We have daily opportunities in Christ to grow and help each other grow in our faith life, prayer life, and marriage life. Keep going or start now! "Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore you on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God." (2 Cor. 5:20 NKJ)
