Troubles with...

FINDING CHRIST in your marriage?

Brief recap from our "Marriage Built to Last" class this past week

First things first...

Why do we have to **SUBMIT** in a marriage!?! Isn't that an *old* thing? Take a look at what Paul writes in Ephesians chapter five:

"Submitting to one another in the fear of God." (v21)

Paul isn't writing just to the Christians in Ephesus, but the whole Church of God by inspiration of the Holy Spirit. As he writes likewise to the Philippians in chapter 2, we are to treat each other "better" than we treat ourselves. There's no room for selfishness. We are to serve others more than we serve ourselves. We know this is especially true in a marriage, that's why he goes on to specify...

22 Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. 23 For the husband is head of the wife, as also Christ is head of the church; and He is the Savior of the body. 24 Therefore, just as the church is subject to Christ, so let the wives be to their own husbands in everything.

There is without a doubt a God prescribed role for a woman within a Christian marriage. Unfortunately, in our society today that word "submit" has some very negative baggage. It's not an enslavement, it's a leadership. What the Lord prescribes for His children is a good thing. Likewise, He has a prescription for a Christian husband a role that is just as demanding and in need of His strength and help!

25 Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her, 26 that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word, 27 that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish. 28 So husbands ought to love their own wives as their own bodies; he who loves his wife loves himself.

Good leadership is hard to find. The Lord expects the husband to be a kindhearted and patient leader for his marriage and family, while looking to his wife for support and strength. The wife looks to her husband for this leadership and supports his role by understanding her own role. This mutual submission to one another is illustrated through Christ's loving eyes in the next two verses of Ephesians:

29 For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as the Lord does the church. 30 For we are members of His body, of His flesh and of His bones.

The reason for these roles for man and woman go back to the Garden of Eden from Genesis chapter two:

31 "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh."

The Lord expands this directive that is for the home, and applies it to His church in the next verse as well:

32 This is a great mystery, but I speak concerning Christ and the church. (c.f. 1 Timothy 2:11-15 also)

After this, he concludes with the attitude a husband and wife are to have for one another:

33 Nevertheless let each one of you in particular so love his own wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband." (Eph. 5:21-33 NKJ)

A great marriage is like a great dance:

- It needs a Choreographer who plans and guides the steps.
- It requires a leader, but mutual submission to those steps.
- It demands clarity of the roles each person plays.
- It results from lots of practice, work, and communication.
- It develops and builds an incredible team.
- It challenges balance, timing, rhythm, and strength.
- It creates joy and mutual fulfillment.
- It is a beautiful thing that points to Christ as the center!

We're hopeful even if you couldn't attend one of these six sessions, that the summary of this series was one that helped give you some new ideas and takeaways for your perception of what a God-pleasing marriage looks like. Jesus Christ is the One who gives the best advice, best forgiveness, and best support to any marriage that needs encouragement and strength. We're praying that our Lord Jesus would continue to be that strength for you and your marriage!


