SERMON

ROMANS 6:15-23

Blessed are those who hear the word of God and keep it. Luke 11:28

What then? Shall we sin because we are not under law but under grace? Certainly not! 16 Do you not know that to whom you present yourselves slaves to obey, you are that one's slaves whom you obey, whether of sin leading to death, or of obedience leading to righteousness? 17 But God be thanked that though you were slaves of sin, yet you obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine to which you were delivered. 18 And having been set free from sin, you became slaves of righteousness. 19 I speak in human terms because of the weakness of your flesh. For just as you presented your members as slaves of uncleanness, and of lawlessness leading to more lawlessness, so now present your members as slaves of righteousness for holiness. 20 For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. 21 What fruit did you have then in the things of which you are now ashamed? DEACONS' REPORT Quarterly Voters' Meeting July 22, 2019

Congregation Survey Feedback

Communion Helpers

- Very split opinions, no clear majority of preference (50/50%)
- The number of helpers/pastors serving on a given Sunday has largely been determined by the amount of men available.

Mailboxes

- Almost entirely positive reception (90/10%)
- Still addressing some concerns (members missing a mailbox, etc.)

Name Tag Sunday(s)

- More positive than negative (about 70/30%)
- We will likely explore this more in the future

Worship Music

- More positive than negative (70/30%)
- Majority praised the variety of musical options and its ability to appeal to a broader spectrum (using both traditional and contemporary styles)

SUMMARY of JULY 22 QUARTERLY VOTERS' MEETING

In membership matters, released per their requests were: Isaac Travaille, Scott Johnson, and Roxann Johnson. Isaac Schmitt was transferred to Messiah, Eau Claire, WI. Accepted into communicant membership by affirmation of faith were William Roettger, Annie Survis, Larry and Holly Overbeek, Robi Cancino III, and Tim Anderson.

The Treasurer's Report showed a short fall in the CLC Cooperative Budget Plan with giving of \$49,648 of our \$55,000 goal. Our general fund budget is ~\$7,000 behind budget, with expenses \$14,000 lower than budgeted and donations ~\$21,000 behind our budgeted amount.

The Board of Deacons presented a summary of the congregation survey results. The outreach committee has started a trial of 15 second radio spots on Alpha Media. And is looking at live streaming the church services, guest slips for visitors, seminars, and lectures. Various benevolent requests have been fielded. The Church picnic on July 21 was fairly well attended. The Communion distribution flow continues to be reviewed. The Elder Committee (Mark Stelter, Michael Wheaton, and Mark Klammer) have been working on call scripts, creating a call committee and a friend and family script.

The Board of Education reported that 13 students graduated May 22. Stephanie Roettger has resumed the full-time Kindergarten call. Erin Radichel has accepted a 30+ hour per week teacher's aide call. Kyle Ochsner has resigned effective after the 2019-2020 school year. Sherman Carstensen has been called to be principal starting 2020-2021. Looking into background checks for all volunteers at the school. There are currently 8 Kindergartners registered for 2019-20. VBS enrollment was ~125 students.

The Board of Property reported that the container was moved to the parking lot. The parking lot will be seal coated the week of July 29-August 2. When the parking lot is re-stripped the first five parking spot will be marked for those with mobility issues. The floor waxing was completed. Numbers were added to the exterior doors. There is interest in installing a chair lift in the church office entry to the sanctuary and down to the basement, the feasibility of the

basement option is being researched. Estimates of lighting the cross were received. Looking at window tinting in the narthex. The Board is considering re-keying the building. Working with the Compensation Committee on the school and church janitor duties and hours. Met with the city on fixing the Second Street and Washington Street sidewalks, when the city does sidewalks the cost is split 80/20 City/Property Owner, the estimate for our part of the sidewalks would be \$4,500-\$6,000, the city is looking to do the work in July or August of 2020. Looking at the carpet in the narthex and sanctuary. A group approached the Board and was given approval to refresh the Mother's Room.

The Expansion/Relocation Committee reported that they continue to look at structures and properties that may work for relocation. A Preschool sub-committee was created to investigate efforts to start a Preschool, the sub-committee presented the potential option of using Salem's classrooms to start a preschool, the sub-committee was given permission to start a conversation with Salem about the possibility.

The Compensation Committee presented a proposal to move our part-time staff to hourly. The assembly approved the move to a per hour salary structure for the Church Custodian, Boiler Operator, School and MPF Custodian, School Secretary, Teacher's Aides, Bulletin Production, and Church Secretary.

It was reported that Grace Schreyer will no longer be able to direct Choir. Grace was thanked for her years of service as director.
