COLOSSIANS 1:21-29 (NASB)

Blessed are those who hear the word of God and keep it. Luke 11: 28

And although you were formerly alienated and hostile in mind, engaged in evil deeds, ²² yet He has now reconciled **you** in His fleshly body through death, in order to present you before Him holv and blameless and beyond reproach ²³ if indeed **you** continue in the faith firmly established and steadfast, and not moved away from the hope of the gospel that **you** have heard, which was proclaimed in all creation under heaven, and of which I, Paul, was made a minister. ²⁴ Now I rejoice in my sufferings for **your** sake, and in my flesh I do my share on behalf of His body (which is the church) in filling up that which is lacking in Christ's afflictions. ²⁵ Of this church I was made a minister according to the stewardship from God bestowed on me for **your** benefit, that I might fully carry out the preaching of the word of God, ²⁶ that is, the mystery which has been hidden from the past ages and generations; but has now been manifested to His saints, 27 to whom God willed to make known what is the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles, which is **Christ in you**, the hope of glory. ²⁸ And we proclaim Him, admonishing every man and teaching every man with all wisdom, that we may present every man **complete in Christ.** ²⁹ And for this purpose also I labor, striving according to His power, which mightily works within me.
