FIRST LESSON JOB 5:17-26

Laughing in the face of danger is the ultimate expression of confidence. Though it rarely ever happens in real life. However, the Christian need not fear danger, destruction, famine or trouble. His confidence is not in himself but in God's perfect wisdom, who chastens those He loves and delivers His people from every evil according to His good pleasure.

SECOND LESSON

LUKE 7:11-17

Congregational Welcome: ♪ Glory be to You, O Lord!

There are two definitions of the word fear: terror and reverence. There was much to be afraid of for the widow of Nain, who had lost her only beloved son as well as her provider. When Jesus sees her, He has compassion and turns terror into reverence by raising her son from the dead. Likewise, because Jesus has risen, our fear turns to thankful reverence now that He has provided our full atonement for sin!

Now it happened, the day after, that He went into a city called Nain; and many of His disciples went with Him, and a large crowd. 12 And when He came near the gate of the city, behold, a dead man was being carried out, the only son of his mother; and she was a widow. And a large crowd from the city was with her. 13 When the Lord saw her, He had compassion on her and said to her, "Do not weep." 14 Then He came and touched the open coffin, and those who carried him stood still. And He said, "Young man, I say to you, arise."

15 So he who was dead sat up and began to speak. And He presented him to his mother. 16 Then fear came upon all, and they glorified God, saying, "A great prophet has risen up among us"; and, "God has visited His people." 17 And this report about Him went throughout all Judea and all the surrounding region.

CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION OF SINS

P: In keeping with the words of the Apostle in 1 Corinthians 10:16, "The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the communion of the body of Christ?"

As well as in 1 Corinthians 11:27-29, which cautions us that: "Therefore whoever eats this bread or drinks this cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner eats and drinks judgment to himself, not discerning the Lord's body."

Let us then, humbly, examine our hearts: Do you confess that you are a sinner before God and deserve His wrath and punishment? Then declare it by saying, "I do confess."

C: I do confess.

- P: Do you humbly seek the Lord's forgiveness, believing that God, by grace, for Jesus' sake, will forgive you all of your sins? Then declare it by saying: "I do believe."
- C: I do believe.
- P: Be assured, your Father in heaven, looks upon you with mercy for Jesus' sake. His Son was wounded for your transgressions and bruised for your iniquities. As the Word of God declares: "For God made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." (2 Cor. 5:21) The Lord comfort your hearts. In Jesus, you are forgiven!

Do you in humble faith recognize that the body and blood of our Lord Jesus are truly present together with the bread and the wine in this blessed sacrament? Then declare it by saying: "By faith I do recognize, and believe."

- C: By faith I do recognize, and believe.
- P: Finally, as a forgiven child of God, do you intend, with the strength of God the Spirit, to amend your sinful life and to put away the sin that so easily entangles and leads you away from our Lord? Then declare it by saying: "I do so intend, with the help of Christ."
- C: I do so intend, with the help of Christ.
- P: Receive then this sacrament with joy, comfort, and peace!

WORDS OF INSTITUTION

P: May this peace of the Lord be with you always!

C: Amen!

DISTRIBUTION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Our Practice of Close Communion: Holy Communion is rightly called a 'Sacrament' because it is a "Sacred act;" not in what WE do for Christ, but in what Christ does for US! Because God's Word presents the reception of this Sacrament as a most intimate expression of spiritual and confessional unity (1 Corinthians 1:10; 10:16-17 Romans 16:17-18), we ask only those who have publicly professed such oneness of faith and belief with us by membership here at Immanuel or another CLC church come forward at this time. This is not a judgment of anyone's faith, but rather an expression of ours. Please speak with either pastor if you are seeking a church home or have any questions. We would love to have you join us. For more information, see the yellow handout in the entry tract rack.

Communing: Members who have difficulty at the kneeling rail may sit in the front pew on either side. The pastors will bring communion to you there. Any communicants sitting in the balcony should please come down to the narthex for direction to the table. Communicants are ushered to the communion table. If you desire the bread in your hand, simply extend your hand to the Pastor as he approaches you with the bread. Those desiring an individual cup, please take a cup when the tray is offered. The common cup will immediately follow. Please dispose of your individual cup in the baskets located behind each pillar or in the center aisle.

GREETER PROGRAM The Outreach Committee has established a greeter program to help reach out and welcome our visitors. Members are welcome and encouraged to introduce any visitors to the scheduled greeter. FROM THE BOARD OF FINANCE: Each year, Immanuel sets its estimated giving to the CLC. On the offering envelopes, this is labeled "Coop. Budg." for CLC Cooperative Budgeted Plan (CBP). Historically, this was labeled Missions. This support of the synod is divided by the synod budgeting process:

- 53% to support ILC (our school for training pastors and teachers),
- 35% missions (both domestic and foreign),
- 11% Trustees (the operations of the synod and the old retirement program), and
- 1% Board of Education and Publications.

In January, Immanuel set it estimated giving to the Coop. Budg. at \$56,500. Our giving to this estimate as of end of August 2019 was \$21,117 or \$2,640 per month, which is 37% of our annual estimate. To meet our annual estimate, we will need \$8,846 per month for the last four months of the year. Please consider this fund when designating your contributions.

Also on your 2019 contribution envelopes, note there is a line under CLC labeled "Mission Dev". Offerings to this category doe not go toward our CBP estimate. This is the CLC's Mission Development Fund, which funds special projects in our overseas and U.S. missions.
