SUMMARY of QUARTERLY VOTERS' MEETING October 21, 2019

In membership matters: Darren Durst, Mac Friedrichs, Hunter Hanel, Luke Olmanson, Jacob Stevens, and Ross Theneman were accepted into voting membership. The confirmation class of 2019 (Hannah Clobes, Jacob Frye, Lauryn Greve, Jaeger Hanel, Elisha Kirksey, Austin Lien, Katrina Mclaughlin, Luiz Reyes, Tatum Stratton, and Rik Thokwath) was accepted into communicant membership, effective 4/28/19. Joe Furst was accepted into communicant membership by confession of faith. Allen and Mary Hansen were transferred to Prince of Peace of Hecla, SD. Brad Leiding, John Klammer with daughters Olivia and Tess, Jennifer Grabow, Michael and Teresa Grabow, Penny Broviak, Rowann Pepper, and Benjamin Grabow where released per their requests.

In elections; Russ Schmitt and Zach Lien were elected to the Board of Education. Ben Busse and Travis Friedrichs were elected to the Board of Property. Scott Kruse was elected to the Board of Finance. There were no nominations for Board of Deacons, the election was postponed to the recessed meeting. The Treasurer's Report showed our offerings at \$406,023 which is 90% of our budgeted goal of \$451,226. And our total income at \$508,871 which is 95% of our goal of \$537,693. And our total expenses at \$618,063 which is 95% of our target of \$650,396. Our current General Fund defect is -\$109,192, which is on target with our budget. Our CLC Cooperative Budget giving is \$25,565, which is below our budget of \$42,375.

The Elders Committee reported that approximately 20 contacts have been made. They are completing a family and friends worksheet, to help people contact their family and friends in the congregation.

The Board of Property reported that the parking lot has been seal coated and striped. Research is still be done on the rear entrance chair lift. A volunteer group is working on painting the Kindergarten and Mothers' Rooms. The church roof is likely to need replacement in the next five years. The committee is looking into the possibility of creating a Facility Manager position. The committee is reviewing contracts for fire inspections and plowing.

The Cemetery Board reported that burials and lot sales are slow. The mowing contract went well this year and cost \$9,965. Volunteers appear to have been effective at mole control. The latest payment from Jordan Sands has been received. The committee is looking into rules around green burials.

A charter was adopted for the Expansion and Relocation Committee. The purpose of the Committee is to facilitate the expansion of the ministry of Immanuel through the relocation of different aspects of the ministry in a fiscally responsible way. The ERC has been directed by the voters to:

- 1) Establish specific goals and a stepped approach to move the church or school into a new facility.
- 2) Identify phases for relocation.
- 3) Establish financial guidelines in conjunction with the finance committee for responsible relocation.
- 4) Develop the criteria for new land purchase.
- 5) Recommend suitable property for the possible relocation of Immanuel.
- 6) Effectively communicate with the various congregational boards when topics of discussion would fall under the purview of a specific board (i.e. financial considerations for relocation should be done in conjunction with the finance board, staffing considerations should be done in conjunction with the board of education).

The Compensation Committee presented two proposals: (1) on compensation for the Principal, Assistant Principal, Administrator, and Tech Coordinator and (2) for a Tiered Tuition Discount for Immanuel Workers. The proposals were sent back to the committee.

The Preschool Committee reported there is substantial interest from within the church and from the community to provide enough students for a preschool and that funds from preschool tuition could pay for the personnel costs and some of the administrative costs of the program. Building costs and some administrative cost would need to be paid for by the church. Building options would be building on site, estimated at \$2,557/month with a \$229,500 down payment; leasing estimated at \$1,056 to \$3,660/month with zero to \$270,000 build-out cost; building offsite estimated at \$3,672/month with a \$306,000 down payment. The Committee suggested that a preschool fund be started.

The Board of Education reported that they are looking for nominations for a math, science and Spanish teacher. They would like nominations with biographies by November 1.

The meeting was recessed to November 4, at 7:00pm.
