THE LORD'S SUPPER

CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION OF SINS / HYMNS OF GRACE

We come before God recognizing that we are sinful and daily need His forgiveness.

From the Augsburg Confession (Articles 1-6)

- P: Our churches with common consent teach: That since the fall of Adam, all people are born with sin, that is, without the fear of God, without trust in God.
- ALL: The Son of God took on man's nature in the womb of the blessed Virgin Mary, so that in Him two natures, the divine and the human, are inseparably joined in one Person, one Christ, true God and true Man.

God would not have the sinner die, His Son with saving grace is nigh, His Spirit in the Word doth teach How man the blessed goal may reach.

TLH 245 (v. 3)

- P: He truly suffered, was crucified, dead, and buried, that He might reconcile the Father unto us, and be a sacrifice, not only for original guilt, but also for all actual sins of humanity.
- ALL: He also descended into hell, and truly rose again the third day; afterward He ascended into heaven that He might sit on the right hand of the Father, and forever reign and have dominion over all creatures,
- P: And sanctify those who believe in Him, by sending the Holy Spirit into their hearts, to rule, to comfort, and to defend them against the devil and the power of sin.
- ALL: The same Christ shall openly come again to judge the living and the dead.
- By grace I'm saved, grace free and boundless; My soul, believe and doubt it not.
 Why stagger at this word of promise?
 Hath Scripture ever falsehood taught?
 Nay; then this word must true remain; By grace thou, too, shalt heav'n obtain.

P: We also believe and confess that human beings cannot be justified before God by their own strength, merits, or works, but are freely justified for Christ's sake through faith,

ALL: When they believe that they are received into favor and that their sins are forgiven for Christ's sake, who, by His death, has made satisfaction for our sins.

 Amazing Grace, how sweet the sound, That saved a wretch like me!
I once was lost but now am found, Was blind but now I see!

WS 777 (v. 1)

TLH 373 (v. 1)

- P: This faith God accounts as righteousness in His sight.
- ALL: So that we may obtain this faith, the ministry of preaching the Gospel and administering the Sacraments was instituted.
- P: For through the Word and Sacraments, as through instruments, the Holy Spirit is given, who works faith where and when it pleases God, in all who hear the Gospel,
- ALL: And the Gospel is this, that God, not because of our own merits, but for Christ's sake, justifies those who believe that they are received into grace for Christ's sake.

Nothing in my hand I bring, Simply to Thy cross I cling; Naked, come to Thee for dress; Helpless, look to Thee for grace; Foul, I to the fountain fly, Wash me, Savior, or I die!

TLH 376 (v. 3)

- P: We also teach that this faith is bound to bring forth good fruits, and that it is necessary to do good works commanded by God because it is God's will.
- ALL: Yet we should not rely on those works to merit justification before God, for the forgiveness of sins and justification are ours by God's grace alone, through faith in Jesus Christ!
- When darkness veils His lovely face, I rest on His unchanging grace; In every high and stormy gale My anchor holds within the veil. On Christ, the solid Rock, I stand; All other ground is sinking sand.

Our Practice of Close Communion: Holy Communion is rightly called a 'Sacrament' because it is a "Sacred act;" not in what WE do for Christ, but in what Christ does for US! Because God's Word presents the reception of this Sacrament as a most intimate expression of spiritual and confessional unity (1 Corinthians 1:10; 10:16-17 Romans 16:17-18), we ask only those who have publicly professed such oneness of faith and belief with us by membership here at Immanuel or another CLC church come forward at this time. This is not a judgment of anyone's faith, but rather an expression of ours. Please speak with either pastor if you are seeking a church home or have any questions. We would love to have you join us. For more information, see the yellow handout in the entry tract rack.

Communing: Members who have difficulty at the kneeling rail may sit in the front pew on either side. The pastors will bring communion to you there. Any communicants sitting in the balcony should please come down to the narthex for direction to the table. Communicants are ushered to the communion table. If you desire the bread in your hand, simply extend your hand to the Pastor as he approaches you with the bread. Those desiring an individual cup, please take a cup when the tray is offered. The common cup will immediately follow. Please dispose of your individual cup in the baskets located behind each pillar or in the center aisle.
