Oh, for a Faith that Will Not Shrink

Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. 2 For by it the elders obtained a good testimony. 3 By faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible. 4 By faith Abel offered to God a more excellent sacrifice than Cain, through which he obtained witness that he was righteous, God testifying of his gifts; and through it he being dead still speaks. 5 By faith Enoch was taken away so that he did not see death, "and was not found, because God had taken him"; for before he was taken he had this testimony, that he pleased God. 6 But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him. 7 By faith Noah, being divinely warned of things not yet seen, moved with godly fear, prepared an ark for the saving of his household, by which he condemned the world and became heir of the righteousness which is according to faith. 8 By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to the place which he would receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going. 9 By faith he dwelt in the land of promise as in a foreign country, dwelling in tents with Isaac and Jacob, the heirs with him of the same promise; 10 for he waited for the city which has foundations, whose builder and maker is God. 11 By faith Sarah herself also received strength to conceive seed, and she bore a child when she was past the age, because she judged Him faithful who had promised. 12 Therefore from one man, and him as good as dead, were born as many as the stars of the sky in multitude-- innumerable as the sand which is by the seashore. 13 These all died in faith, not having received the promises, but having seen them afar off were assured of them, embraced them and confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth. 14 For those who say such things declare plainly that they seek a homeland. 15 And truly if they had called to mind that country from which they had come out, they would have had opportunity to return. 16 But now they desire a better, that is, a heavenly country. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for He has prepared a city for them.

SUMMARY OF ANNUAL VOTERS' MEETING January 20, 2020

In membership matters, Deborah Sandvik; Paul C. and Stephanie Nolting with children Jonah, Nora, and Martha; and Eli Travaille were released. Scott Osborne was accepted into membership by confession of faith. Harold and Sue Abbas were accepted into communicant membership by transfer from Sleepy Eye, MN.

The Treasurer's Report showed a year end deficit of \$44,252. Giving was around \$60,000 behind budget, and expenses were \$10,000 below budget. Our Mission giving was \$52,291 on an estimate of \$56,500.

Mark Stelter was elected Congregational President. Alan Olmanson was elected Congregational Secretary, Tom Lentz, Lee Becker and Mark Geiger were elected to the Auditing Committee. Doug Schaller and Daniel Pfeiffer were elected as Delegates to the CLC. Paul Bade and Zach Lien were elected as alternate Delegates.

Annual Reports were received.

A project fund was created for purchasing and installing a person lift from back church entry up to the sanctuary level. The estimated cost is \$8,000 to \$9,000.

The meeting was recessed to Monday, February 3, 2020 at 7:00pm.
