OLD TESTAMENT READING JOB 19:25-27

The LORD had allowed Job to suffer. A lot. He had lost his possessions, his family, even his health. But the LORD was still in control and allowed these trials to come into Job's life in order to strengthen his faith and to lead him back to the LORD. Job makes such a confession here - a confession in the knowledge that there is life after death, and that we will see our risen Savior in eternity. How my heart yearns for that day!

25 For I know that my Redeemer lives, And He shall stand at last on the earth; 26 And after my skin is destroyed, this I know, That in my flesh I shall see God, 27 Whom I shall see for myself, And my eyes shall behold, and not another. How my heart yearns within me!

EPISTLE READING 1 PETER 1:17-2:3

The same Peter who denied Jesus, and whom the Lord called to feed and tend His church describes the impact Christ's death and resurrection has on our lives. We have been "redeemed" and "born again" tasting the Lord's grace through the power of God's word. Our lives are not our own. We belong to Christ, and no longer need to fear death!

Congregational Praise (sung): Hallelujah! Hallelujah! Hallelujah!

17 And if you call on the Father, who without partiality judges according to each one's work, conduct yourselves throughout the time of your stay here in fear; 18 knowing that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold, from your aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers, 19 but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot. 20 He indeed was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in these last times for you 21 who through Him believe in God, who raised Him from the dead and gave Him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God. 22 Since you have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit in sincere love of the brethren, love one another fervently with a pure heart, 23 having been born again, not of corruptible seed but incorruptible, through the word of God which lives and abides forever, 24 because

"All flesh is as grass, And all the glory of man as the flower of the grass. The grass withers, And its flower falls away, **25** But the word of the Lord endures forever."

Now this is the word which by the gospel was preached to you.

2:1 Therefore, laying aside all malice, all deceit, hypocrisy, envy, and all evil speaking, 2 as newborn babes, desire the pure milk of the word, that you may grow thereby, 3 if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is gracious.

GOSPEL READING JOHN 21;1-14

Our Gospel text for today is the context that leads up to our Sermon meditation. Here we see the setting of the disciples getting a bit stir crazy and heading out to fish. It is fantastic that Jesus picks the same place that He first called these fishermen to follow Him. There are several lessons to be learned here from our Lord. One is His ongoing provision for His followers. Another, more importantly, is the breakfast discussion He has planned for Peter and the rest of them about mercy, forgiveness, and recommitment.

Congregational Welcome (sung): Glory be to You, O Lord!

1 After these things Jesus showed Himself again to the disciples at the Sea of Tiberias, and in this way He showed Himself: 2 Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of His disciples were together. 3 Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We are going with you also." They went out and immediately got into the boat, and that night they caught nothing. 4 But when the morning had now come, Jesus stood on the shore; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. 5 Then Jesus said to them, "Children, have you any food?" They answered Him, "No." 6 And He said to them, "Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast, and now they were not able to draw it in because of the multitude of fish. 7 Therefore that disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" Now when Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his outer garment (for he had removed it), and plunged into the sea. 8 But the other disciples came in the little boat (for they were not far from land, but about two hundred cubits), dragging the net with fish. 9 Then, as soon as they had come to land, they saw a fire of coals there, and fish laid on it, and bread. 10 Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish which you have just caught." 11 Simon Peter went up and dragged the net to land, full of large fish, one hundred and fifty-three; and although there were so many, the net was not broken. 12 Jesus said to them, "Come and eat breakfast." Yet none of the disciples dared ask Him, "Who are You?"-knowing that it was the Lord. 13 Jesus then came and took the bread and gave it to them, and likewise the fish. 14 This is now the third time Jesus showed Himself to His disciples after He was raised from the dead.

Congregational Response (sung): Praise be to You, O Christ!

CONFESSION OF FAITPH SECOND ARTICLE (REDEMPTION)

I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was

crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From there He will come to judge the living and the dead.

This is most certainly true.

SERMON JOHN 21:15-19 (EHV)

Jesus said, "...Blessed are those who hear the word of God and keep it!" Luke 11:28

15 When they had eaten breakfast, Jesus asked Simon Peter,

"Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?"

"Yes, Lord," he said, "you know that I care about you."

Jesus told him, "Feed my lambs."

16 A second time Jesus asked him,

"Simon, son of John, do you love me?"

He said, "Yes, Lord, you know that I care about you." Jesus told him, "Be a shepherd for my sheep."

17 He asked him the third time,

"Simon, son of John, do you care about me?"

Peter was grieved because Jesus asked him the third time,

"Do you care about me?"

He answered, "Lord, you know all things.

You know that <mark>I care about you</mark>."

"Feed my sheep," Jesus said.

18 "Amen, Amen, I tell you: When you were young, you dressed yourself and went wherever you wanted. But when you are old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will tie you and carry you where you do not want to go." 19 Jesus said this to indicate the kind of death by which Peter would glorify God. After saying this, he told him, "Follow me."
