FIRST LESSON HEBREWS 4:14-16

Congregational Praise: → Hallelujah! Hallelujah! Hallelujah! (TLH pg. 20, 2nd tune)

Do you think of the resurrection of Jesus as a past event that has no bearing on your life today? You shouldn't! The fact that Jesus is alive means that He now intercedes

on our behalf before our Father in heaven. We can come to God's throne in prayer with boldness, knowing that He will answer you and give you the mercy and grace that you need and when you need.

Since then we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. 15 For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. 16 Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

GRADUAL PSALM 100

This Sunday is known as Jubilate Sunday, which is Latin for "praise". On this Sunday, the church continues to sing of its joy in the resurrection and the hope that it brings. This Psalm is especially appropriate as it is full of joy, gladness, praise, thanksgiving, and singing. Our rejoicing takes the form of singing and service to the LORD in thanksgiving for all His mercy and goodness toward us. Praise the LORD!

SECOND LESSON JOHN 14:1-11

Congregational Welcome: ♪ Glory be to You, O Lord! (TLH pg. 21)

These words were spoken by Jesus to His disciples on Maundy Thursday night. Jesus prepares them for what will happen in the coming hours and days. Through His death and resurrection Jesus would open the door to heaven for sinners. Jesus also describes His relationship with the Father in detail, so that we know that through Jesus we have access to the Father as well.

"Let not your heart be troubled; you believe in God, believe also in Me. 2 In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. 3 And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also. 4 And where I go you know, and the way you know." 5 Thomas said to Him, "Lord, we do not know where You are going, and how can we know the way?" 6 Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me. 7 "If you had known Me, you would have known My Father also; and from now on you know Him and have seen Him." 8 Philip said to Him, "Lord, show us the Father, and it is sufficient for us." 9 Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you so long, and yet you have not known Me, Philip? He who has seen Me has seen the Father; so how can you say, 'Show us the Father'? 10 Do you not believe that I am in the Father, and the Father in Me? The words that I speak to you I do not speak on My own authority; but the Father who dwells in Me does the works. 11 Believe Me that I am in the Father and the Father in Me, or else believe Me for the sake of the works themselves.

THE INSTITUTION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Members of Immanuel, now is the time to have your Communion supplies on hand and ready to go. Following our Communion liturgy here, we will have just one table where I instruct you to take and eat, and take and drink. Though it is not the same as being in person with one another, we can rejoice that our Lord Jesus continues to unite us in Word, and Sacrament.

P: Holy Communion is called the Lord's Supper, the Lord's Table, and the Sacrament of the Altar. What is the Sacrament of the Altar? 1 Cor. 11:20; 10:21; 11:24

ALL: It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, given to us Christians under the bread and wine to eat and to drink, as it was instituted by Christ Himself.

Red Hymnal 315 (v. 1)

P: But where is this written?

ALL: The holy evangelists Matthew, Mark, Luke, and the apostle Paul write this way:

P: "Our Lord Jesus Christ, the same night in which He was betrayed, took bread; and, when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to His disciples saying, 'Take, eat. This is My body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of Me.'

ALL: In the same way He took the cup, after supper, gave thanks, and gave it to them saying,

P: 'Drink of it, all of you. This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.'"

Weary am I and heavy laden, With sin my soul is sore opprest; Receive me graciously, and gladden, My heart, for I am now Thy guest. Lord, may Thy body and Thy blood, Be for my soul the highest good!

Red Hymnal 315 (v. 6)

THE BLESSINGS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

P: What is the benefit of this eating and drinking?

ALL: The words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," show us that God gives forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation through the Sacrament.

P: For where there is forgiveness of sins,

ALL: There is also life and salvation!

What higher gift can we inherit?
It is faith's bond and solid base;
It is the strength of heart and spirit,
The covenant of hope and grace.
Lord, may Thy body and Thy blood,
Be for my soul the highest good!

Red Hymnal 315 (v. 9)

THE POWER OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

P: How can eating and drinking do such wonderful things?

ALL: Eating and drinking actually do nothing. It is the words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins" which do this.

P: These words, together with the bodily eating and drinking, are the main part of the Sacrament.

ALL: Whoever believes these words has exactly what they say: forgiveness of sins.

Thy body given for me O Savior,
Thy blood which Thou for me didst shed
These are my life and strength forever,
By them my hungry soul is fed.
Lord, may Thy body and Thy blood,
Be for my soul the highest good!

Red Hymnal 315 (v. 11)

THE RECEPTION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

- P: When is one properly prepared to receive this Sacrament?
- ALL: Customs in connection with eating and clothing are indeed a fine preparation.
- P: However, a person is truly worthy and well-prepared who has faith in these words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins."
- ALL: Whoever does not believe these words or doubts them is unworthy and unprepared. The words, "for you," require nothing but believing hearts.
- Who can condemn me now? For surely The Lord is nigh, who justifies.
 No hell I fear, and thus securely, With Jesus I to heaven rise.
 Lord, may Thy body and Thy blood, Be for my soul the highest good!

Red Hymnal 315 (v. 13)

SUMMARY of QUARTERLY VOTERS' MEETING 4/20/2020

In membership matters, Lara Meadows was released per her request.

Neil Bernthal was called to teach High School Math and Science.

The Elders are attempting to contact uninvolved member. If contact cannot be established, the Board of Deacons will be requesting release for these uninvolved members at the October Quarterly meeting.

The Deacons are working on an approach to conducting communion services during social distancing requirements.

The Treasurer's Report showed at we started the year -\$44,254 in the general fund, at the end of Q1 we are -\$117,200 in the general fund a loss of \$72,946. Our plate offerings are 69.67% of budget (\$183,506 budgeted, \$120,174 given). Our CLC CBP offerings were budgeted at \$14,250 and were \$9,090. For the CLC Fiscal year we provided a \$56,500 estimate and are currently at \$46,107.

We have been approved for a Federal CARES Paycheck Protection Program loan for \$139,800 at 1% for 2 years. If we use 75% (\$104,850) for salaries in an 8 week window, that amount plus any amount for utilities can be forgiven. We expect to use between \$110,000 and \$116,000 for salaries, and \$7,000 for utilities. The Board of Finance's plan is to pay back any amount not forgiven as quickly as possible after forgiveness is granted or denied.

The Church will pay part-time workers no less than their average pay for an eight-week period determined by the Treasurer.

The Board of Property reported that a stair-lift in the alley church entry will not work (it will not leave enough room). Looking into doing some tuck-pointing on the building. Scheduling regular work days. Looking at purchasing a new waxer/buffer. A Knox box will be install for fire/police emergency access. Temporarily canceled the rug service, reduced garbage collection to every other week, and closed the playground (following the lead of the city parks).

Cemetery Board reported that Holtmeier will be taking over the contract Jordan Sands had for acres to the North of the Cemetery, including the eventual refilling of the quarry. They will be coordinating with the Sexton around funerals and quarry blasting. An insurance claim was submitted for the damage to the fence. There was a cleanup day and a couple more will be held this year. The moles have come back and help will be needed again to deal with them.

The meeting was recessed to the call of the chairman.
