President's Message

Judging by the first six months, 2020 will be the year that many people would just as soon forget. It has been a time of upheaval, uncertainty, and isolation. Comfortable routines have morphed into a "new normal."

Yet through it all, one thing hasn't changed in the least—God's grace toward undeserving sinners. In the face of a worldwide pandemic, David's words still ring true: "Praise the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits—who forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases" (Psalm 103:2-3). Civil unrest reflects the natural hostility in every heart toward God and neighbor, but God's love in Christ has created new hearts within us and brought us together in the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. In spite of countless other cancellations, the message that God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself has been proclaimed without interruption, albeit online rather than in person for a time.

It is incredibly reassuring to know that no matter what happens politically, socially, or materially, our triune God remains the same. The Father who loves us with an everlasting love, the Son who sacrificed His own holy life that we might live, and the Holy Spirit who began His good work within us and will certainly preserve His own in the one true faith until we rejoice with the entire Church in the glory to come.

Instead of being discouraged and feeling sorry for ourselves over the difficulties of the past months, we have reason for great thanksgiving. This spring two young men graduated from Immanuel seminary and a young woman graduated from the teaching program. As individual congregations have adopted new ways of carrying on their ministries, so our foreign missionaries have adapted to changed circumstances and continue to instruct and encourage our brothers and sisters in Christ in numerous overseas nations.

I thank the Committee on Partners in the Public Ministry (CPPM) for their work in publicizing the growing need in our church body for pastors and teachers and for proposing ways by which we can encourage young men and women to prepare for this blessed work. I have asked the committee to continue their work until next summer's Convention.

There was concern among some that the suspension of in-person services during the pandemic would also lead to a shortfall in offerings for our joint work as the CLC. That has not happened. Contrary to what human reason might assume, the Spirit has provided the means and opened hearts to give even more generously of material things for spiritual returns, not just in recent months but for a number of years. This has resulted in a growing financial reserve. We pray that the Lord will direct us in soon putting these funds to work in current and new programs for the spread of His kingdom in these last days before His return.

Among all the cancellations and postponements, one of the most difficult to make was the postponement of the 2020 CLC Convention until the summer of 2021. The biennial gathering of pastors, teachers, and delegates from across the country is a highlight in our CLC life. Planning and working together on the many areas of ministry the Lord has placed before us is an exciting task. Receiving Word and Sacrament together is uplifting and refreshing to the soul. Reconnecting with fellow believers from sister congregations and meeting new CLC members strengthen the "family bonds" which are so precious in these polarized times. Yet I believe Christian love shown in sensitivity toward the feelings and vulnerabilities of others, as well as logistical difficulties in holding a convention at this time, made postponement necessary. As a result of the postponement, those in elected positions whose terms expire this summer will have their terms extended one year.

We have much to be thankful for. I am grateful to the Lord for giving our congregations the flexibility and patience to work through the difficulties of these past months in order to carry out the proclamation of Christ crucified and risen. Rather than a one-size-fits-all approach, our congregations have shown wisdom in assessing their own unique circumstances and exercised good judgment in determining how best to go forward in both respect toward God-appointed authorities and in giving to God the glory due Him. May the Lord in His grace bless our fellowship and joint work in the future as He has done so faithfully throughout the past 60 years of our history.
