VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES As we begin to reopen and return to church, now is a good time for us to reevaluate the many different volunteer positions that are necessary for the weekly operation of our church. With that in mind, the Board of Deacons is encouraging all of our members to consider their God-given talents and consider volunteering for the following positions.

1. Slideshow Director This is an easy way to contribute to the service by clicking through the slides during the service. You are able to do so from any place in the Sanctuary.

2. Video Camera Conductor Any experience with a camera qualifies you to keep the pastor centered in the video camera. Because of the new LiveStream format, this job has become simpler.

3. LiveStream Operator This position is a little more technical and involves switching between different scenes in order to cast the slideshow onto the YouTube livestream. Training will be available to anyone who is interested.

4. Sound Booth Monitor Although the soundboard looks intimidating, a quick introduction is all you need to manage the sound in the worship service.

ERC: Should Immanuel Stay or Relocate? The Expansion Relocation Committee (ERC) is re-investigating why certain areas of our current Immanuel campus are problematic. We hope to try to expand on these areas for the congregation in the coming months. Over the years, some of the major concerns the congregation has about our current campus are related to **parking congestion**:

- **Closer off street parking** because of the apartment buildings nearby, there is limited street parking especially on weekends.
- **Traffic flow** as the business of 2nd street continues to rise, so do our concerns about traffic safety with our exit (Mankato Downtown Plan).
- Pedestrian safety also, as 2nd street gains more traffic so do the concerns for the children on the playground or high school age who walk offsite.
- **Snow plowing** there are challenges most years of where to pile snow accumulation, which also impacts our parking lot.
- Allow for more vehicles there's not enough stalls in our current lot for all of our members (we have 35 stalls on site).

- **Dedicated off street staff parking** during the school year, the parking lot is needed for recess for the children.
- **Handicap parking** we are limited on the handicap and elderly parking accessibility around the building.

Questions to consider:

- Are there ways to resolve these concerns with our current property?
- Do you think these areas alone justify moving to a different location?

SUMMARY of QUARTERLY VOTERS' MEETING July 27, 2020

In membership matters, Carol Jackson was released per her request. John Mickelson was accepted into communicant membership. Ross and Jackie Libby were accepted into communicant membership with baptized children Chauncey, Fin and Grayson.

The Treasurer's report showed our general fund down \$64,322 since the beginning of the year. We had budgeted to be \$35,000 behind. Our plate giving was \$294,493 against our budget of \$334,235. Our expenses were \$429,197 versus a budget goal of \$448,027. We met our CLC Cooperative Budget goal for 2019-2020 with \$56,868.43.

The Board of Property reported that the MPF, lower level of school and church basement had flooded from a sewer backup during the mega rain event. The Board has two bids for tuck pointing the church wall above the school building. The bricks in the bricked up window need to be taken out and relaid, the ties have become disconnected. The bids are \$16,500 and \$15,000, the board recommends the \$15,000 bid. It was decided to proceed with the brick repair on the church above the school using the Major Improvement Fund. And using the Board of Property's preferred bid (\$15,000) and volunteer labor were possible.

The Board of Education reported that they plan to have students in the school this fall. Temporary classrooms will likely be created in the basement. School will be starting at 8:20 due to busing changes. The 2020 CLC Teacher conference has been canceled. Part-time teaching calls were reduced by 1.15 hours/week (3 hours/week from Spanish, and adding 2.85 for music). The school will need 3 teachers aides from 8:00am to 3:00pm for the COVID-19 reopening plan. (\$7,923 for additional aide time). The current 53 aide hours/week would cover part of this need. For the duration of the COVID-19 reopening plan, which calls for greater social distance between students, the school will increase teachers aide time by 40 hours/week or 8 hours/school day to implement our response. (The net change to the budget is \$960).

The meeting was recessed to the call of the chairman.
