Immanuel Announcements

A NEW CHURCH YEAR At the end of this month we will begin a new church year, and with a new church year comes a new series of texts and readings for our worship services. Your pastors don't choose random sermon texts and readings each week, but follow a lectionary, which is a set of pre-chosen readings for the entire church year. This practice was used by the Jews during and before the time of Jesus, and was also utilized in the early New Testament church, using readings from the Gospels and Epistles. This year we will be following the Thomasius Lectionary which was developed over 150 years ago by a German pastor and professor by the name Gottfried Thomasius. Thomasius served in Erlangen and Nuremberg as a pastor until he accepted a position at the University of Erlangen in 1842. There he served the university as a dogmatics professor and as the "university chaplain" for over 30 years. He was extremely influential as a teacher during these years, and it was there that he prepared this lectionary for use in the church. In 1865 the General Synod of Bavaria recommended his lectionary for use in the churches of Bavaria, Germany.

The Thomasius lectionary has some unique characteristics. There are a number of familiar readings that we will find in other lectionaries, but there are also some that are uncommon. These new readings are refreshing. The lectionary will follow the book of Hebrews during the season of Lent, and the book of Revelation through the Easter season. When we enter the Trinity season it will use a Bible History approach to take us chronologically through the Old Testament, beginning with Abraham and finishing during the ministry of the prophet Isaiah during the kings of Judah. As we journey through the Old Testament, we will simultaneously work our way through the history of the early church using the book of Acts for the first 13 weeks, before we dig into some of the New Testament epistles.

We enter a new year with confidence that the LORD will bless our study of His Word of truth, as we meditate on the works of the LORD, Who alone is our hope and our salvation!

MANDATE UPDATE This past week Governor Walz issued Executive Order 20-96. This Order is an amendment to Executive Order 20-74. This amendment was meant primarily to restrict the size of social gatherings and organizations who offer food or drink. However, the amendment did not make any changes to paragraph 6.C.v.B. which reads,

In indoor settings, occupancy must not exceed 50 percent of the normal occupant capacity as determined by the fire marshal, with a maximum of 250 people in a single self-contained space.
