OLD TESTAMENT READING NUMBERS 21:4-9

Are you content? In this account, the LORD directs our attention to the unbelief of the children of Israel which was rooted in their lack of contentment. The LORD's judgment was just, and His mercy was also clearly seen. Contentment and LIFE is found in looking to and trusting in the mercy of God revealed in the One Who was hung on a pole on Calvary and crucified for sinners.

Then they journeyed from Mount Hor by the Way of the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; and the soul of the people became very discouraged on the way. **5** And the people spoke against God and against Moses: "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and our soul loathes this worthless bread." **6** So the LORD sent fiery serpents among the people, and they bit the people; and many of the people of Israel died. **7** Therefore the people came to Moses, and said, "We have sinned, for we have spoken against the LORD and against you; pray to the LORD that He take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people. **8** Then the LORD said to Moses, "Make a fiery serpent, and set it on a pole; and it shall be that everyone who is bitten, when he looks at it, shall live." **9** So Moses made a bronze serpent, and put it on a pole; and so it was, if a serpent had bitten anyone, when he looked at the bronze serpent, he lived.

RESPONSIVE READING PSALM 22:11-21

The believers of the Old Testament also looked to the suffering and death of Jesus for salvation. This "Messianic" Psalm clearly portrayed the crucifixion of Jesus and what He would suffer for our salvation: Surrounded by enemies, physical weakness and agony, dehydration, and death. Even more specific, He would be pierced, but His bones would not be broken, and His clothes would be gambled for! All this clearly fulfilled by Jesus on Calvary!

P: Be not far from Me, For trouble is near;

C: For there is none to help.

P: Many bulls have surrounded Me; Strong bulls of Bashan have encircled Me.

C: They gape at Me with their mouths, Like a raging and roaring lion.

GOSPEL READING JOHN 12:23-33

Jesus again reveals to His disciples the purpose of His coming. His purpose was death. But through His death, LIFE would spring forth. Through His death, He would conquer the devil and release the death grip he held over humanity because of sin. Jesus knew what His purpose was and He knew what that purpose would accomplish for sinners. This is what motivated Him to selflessly fulfill that purpose despite the agonizing cost to Himself!

Congregational Welcome: ♪ Glory be to You, O Lord!

But Jesus answered them, saying, "The hour has come that the Son of Man should be glorified. **24** "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it produces much grain. **25** "He who loves his life will lose it, and he who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. **26** "If anyone serves Me, let him follow Me; and where I am, there My servant will be also. If anyone serves Me, him My Father will honor. **27** "Now My soul is troubled, and what shall I say?" Father, save Me from this hour '? But for this purpose I came to this hour. **28** "Father, glorify Your name." Then a voice came from heaven, saying, "I have both glorified it and will glorify it again." **29** Therefore the people who stood by and heard it said that it had thundered. Others said, "An angel has spoken to Him." **30** Jesus answered and said, "This voice did not come because of Me, but for your sake. **31** "Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this

world will be cast out. **32** "And I, if I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all peoples to Myself." **33** This He said, signifying by what death He would die.

SERMON HEBREWS 7:23-28

Also there were many priests, because they were prevented by death from continuing. **24** But He, because He continues forever, has an unchangeable priesthood. **25** Therefore He is also able to save to the uttermost those who come to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them. **26** For such a High Priest was fitting for us, who is holy, harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners, and has become higher than the heavens; **27** who does not need daily, as those high priests, to offer up sacrifices, first for His own sins and then for the people's, for this He did once for all when He offered up Himself. [**28** For the law appoints as high priests men who have weakness, but the word of the oath, which came after the law, appoints the Son who has been perfected forever.]

ERC: Should Immanuel Relocate? The Expansion Relocation

Committee is re-investigating why certain areas of our current Immanuel campus are problematic. We hope to try to expand on these areas for the congregation in the coming months. Over the years, some of the major concerns the congregation has about our current campus have been:

Parking <> Multiple Level <> Preschool <> Facility Congestion <> SECURITY <> Storage <> Green Space <> Maintenance & Operational Costs <> Location

- Security
- Neighborhood Safety has been a concern for many years for both the church and the school. Protests downtown that are not always so peaceful. Crime in the area has continued with shootings, drugs, etc.
 - How can we help affect positive change in the neighborhood and what effort would that take from Immanuel?
- The multiple active entrances make surveillance more challenging and give opportunity for unauthorized entry. This makes it also more difficult to secure the facility in the case of a hostile event with all of the ground floor windows.
- The joined school and church facilities are a blessing, but also brings security issues during special services or school events (more places to get to or hide).
- The keys and entrance access have been an area of question for several years.

Questions to consider:

- Are there ways to resolve these concerns with our current property?
- Do you think these areas alone justify moving to a different location?

HOLY WEEK WORSHIP ADDITIONS In Old Testament times, the Passover Festival commemorated God's deliverance of the Children of Israel from Egyptian slavery. The high point of this feast was in the slaughtering of the spotless lamb. As commanded by the LORD, they ate the lamb, and spread its blood on the doorposts so the Angel of the LORD would pass over them and spare them. This Passover celebration lasted from the 14th to the 21st day of the Hebrew month Nisan. For the New Testament Christian, we celebrate Holy Week commemorating God's deliverance of all people from their slavery to sin. The high points of this celebration include:

- Palm Sunday when Jesus entered into Jerusalem,
- Maundy Thursday when Jesus institutes the Lord's Supper (Holy Communion),
- Good Friday when Jesus was sacrificed as our spotless Lamb once and for all, and
- Easter Sunday when Jesus rose from the dead giving us the confidence in His promise of our eternal life.

This year we are planning on more opportunities to reflect on the many detailed events of Holy Week. Along with our usual celebration worship times listed above, we plan to also hold three shorter, school chapel services Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday before the start of school. The chapels (school only) can be attended on livestream, or watched later in the day as they will be recorded. These shorter services will consist of an open and closing hymn, the Scripture reading of what Jesus did and said that day during Holy Week, a few devotional thoughts, and prayer. We encourage you to participate in as much as you are able to in order to get the full picture of what happened that week when Jesus fulfilled His promise to defeat sin, death, and the devil for us all!
