# OUR LORD SPEAKS TO US

## OLD TESTAMENT READING GENESIS 22:1-19

---

*"The LORD will provide." This was the message God communicated to his servant, Abraham, through this extremely difficult test. Nothing was more important to Abraham, in terms of earthly blessings, than his son, Isaac. Surely Abraham was shocked and confused when the LORD demanded Abraham to sacrifice his only son. Yet in this moment of trial, Abraham relied upon God's promises which ultimately pointed to Jesus. Because God did not spare His Son, Isaac had a substitute. Likewise, this Lenten season reminds us once again that "The LORD will provide" for us.*

## Congregational Praise ♪: Hallelujah! Hallelujah! Hallelujah!

Now it came to pass after these things that God tested Abraham, and said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." **2** Then He said, "Take now your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you." **3** So Abraham rose early in the morning and saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and Isaac his son; and he split the wood for the burnt offering, and arose and went to the place of which God had told him. **4** Then on the third day Abraham lifted his eyes and saw the place afar off. **5** And Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; the lad and I will go yonder and worship, and we will come back to you."

**6** So Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on Isaac his son; and he took the fire in his hand, and a knife, and the two of them went together. **7** But Isaac spoke to Abraham his father and said, "My father!" And he said, "Here I am, my son." Then he said, "Look, the fire and the wood, but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" **8** And Abraham said, "My son, God will provide for Himself the lamb for a burnt offering." So the two of them went together.

**9** Then they came to the place of which God had told him. And Abraham built an altar there and placed the wood in order; and he bound Isaac his son and laid him on the altar, upon the wood. **10** And Abraham stretched out his hand and took the knife to slay his son. **11** But the Angel of the LORD called to him from heaven and said, "Abraham, Abraham!" So he said, "Here I am." **12** And He said, "Do not lay your hand on the lad, or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from Me." **13** Then Abraham lifted his eyes and looked, and there behind him was a ram caught in a thicket by its horns. So Abraham went and took the ram, and offered it up for a burnt offering instead of his son.

**14** And Abraham called the name of the place, The-LORD-Will-Provide; as it is said to this day, "In the Mount of The LORD it shall be provided."

**15** Then the Angel of the LORD called to Abraham a second time out of heaven, **16** and said: "By Myself I have sworn, says the LORD, because you have done this thing, and have not withheld your son, your only son-- **17** "blessing I will bless you, and multiplying I will multiply your descendants as the stars of the heaven and as the sand which is on the seashore; and your descendants shall possess the gate of their enemies. **18** "In your seed all the nations of the earth shall be blessed, because you have obeyed My voice." **19** So Abraham returned to his young men, and they rose and went together to Beersheba; and Abraham dwelt at Beersheba.

## RESPONSIVE READING PSALM 22:1-10

---

*This is one of the Messianic psalms meaning that it directly prophesied of the work that Jesus would do. In this case, the Messiah's work is suffering for our sins and laying down His life upon the cross. By inspiration of the Holy Spirit, David records graphic details of our Savior's passion in these words. What a blessing to see God's grace for sinners so clearly articulated in His Word!*

P: My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me? Why are You so far from helping Me, And from the words of My groaning?

C: O My God, I cry in the daytime, but You do not hear; And in the night season, and am not silent.

P: But You are holy, Enthroned in the praises of Israel.

C: Our fathers trusted in You; They trusted, and You delivered them.

P: They cried to You, and were delivered;

C: They trusted in You, and were not ashamed.

P: But I am a worm, and no man; A reproach of men, and despised by the people. All those who see Me ridicule Me; They shoot out the lip, they shake the head, saying,

C: "He trusted in the LORD, let Him rescue Him; Let Him deliver Him, since He delights in Him!"

P: But You are He who took Me out of the womb; You made Me trust while on My mother's breasts.

C: I was cast upon You from birth. From My mother's womb You have been My God.

All: Amen!

## EPISTLE READING HEBREWS 5:1-10

---

*Jesus' role as priest was an important part of His suffering and payment for sin. In this role, Jesus was unique - resembling the priests of the Old Testament but also set apart from all others. This uniqueness was that Jesus was both the priest and the sacrifice; namely, that He willingly gave Himself as the offering for sin. No other priest, however important, could claim the same status. Because we have a priest like Jesus, we have assurance that sin has been paid for in full.*

Congregational Welcome : ♪ Glory be to You, O Lord!

For every high priest taken from among men is appointed for men in things pertaining to God, that he may offer both gifts and sacrifices for sins. **2** He can have compassion on those who are ignorant and going astray, since he himself is also subject to weakness. **3** Because of this he is required as for the people, so also for himself, to offer sacrifices for sins. **4** And no man takes this honor to himself, but he who is called by God, just as Aaron was. **5** So also Christ did not glorify Himself to become High Priest, but it was He who said to Him: "You are My Son, Today I have begotten You." **6** As He also says in another place: "You are a priest forever According to the order of Melchizedek"; **7** who, in the days of His flesh, when He had offered up prayers and supplications, with vehement cries and tears to Him who was able to save Him from death, and was heard because of His godly fear, **8** though He was a Son, yet He learned obedience by the things which He suffered. **9** And having been perfected, He became the author of eternal salvation to all who obey Him, **10** called by God as High Priest "according to the order of Melchizedek,"

SERMON JOHN 10:24-33

So the Jews gathered around Jesus, asking, "How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Christ, tell us plainly." **25** Jesus answered them, "I did tell you, but you do not believe. The works I am doing in my Father's name testify about me. **26** But you do not believe, because you are not my sheep, as I said to you. **27** My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. **28** I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand. **29** My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all. No one can snatch them out of my Father's hand. **30** I and the Father are one."

### CONFESSION

P: Having heard God's Word, let us confess our sins to Him. Do you sincerely confess that you have sinned against God and deserve His wrath and punishment? Then declare so by saying: I do confess.

P: Surely, you should confess; for the Word of God declares: "If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us."

**C: ♪ I come, O Savior, to Thy Table, For weak and weary is my soul;  
Thou, Bread of Life, alone art able, To satisfy and make me whole: Lord,  
may Thy body and Thy blood, Be for my soul the highest good!**

### REPENTANCE

P: Do you repent of all your sins committed in thought, word, and deed, as well as the sin of failing to do what God expects to be done? Then declare so by saying: I do repent.

**C: I do repent.**

P: Surely, you should repent, as did the penitent sinners: David, who prayed for a sorrowful heart; Peter, who wept bitterly; the sinful woman; the prodigal son; and many others.

**C: ♪ Weary am I and heavy laden, With sin my soul is sore opprest;  
Receive me graciously, and gladden, My heart, for I am now Thy guest.  
Lord, may Thy body and Thy blood, Be for my soul the highest good!**

## FORGIVENESS

P: Do you believe that God, through His undeserved grace and love for us, for Jesus' sake, forgives you all of your sins? Then declare so by saying: I do believe.

**C: I do believe.**

P: Surely, you should believe, for Holy Scripture declares: "God so loved the world that He gave His only-begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life."

**C: ♪ What higher gift can we inherit? It is faith's bond and solid base; It is the strength of heart and spirit, The covenant of hope and grace. Lord, may Thy body and Thy blood, Be for my soul the highest good!**

P: Do you promise with the help of the Holy Spirit, that you hope to amend your sinful life? Declare it to God in saying: I do promise.

**Congregation: I do promise.**

## OBEDIENCE

P: Surely, this is a good promise, for Christ, our Lord, tells us to: "Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven."

P: Finally, do you believe that through me, a called servant of God, by the authority and command of our Lord Jesus Christ, you receive from God this blessed forgiveness and assurance of all your sins? Then joyfully declare it by saying: By the grace of my Lord Jesus Christ, I do believe.

**C: By the grace of my Lord Jesus Christ, I do believe.**

P: As you believe, even so may it be for you! On this confession of your sins, I announce the grace and peace of God to you, and by the authority and command of our Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all of your

sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

**SUMMARY OF SPECIAL VOTERS MEETING** Approval was given to spend up to \$8,500 from the New Equipment Fund on the sanctuary video set-up to improve live-streaming and recording capabilities in the sanctuary. Approval was given to spend up to \$15,000 from undesignated reserves to replace the 30 year old high school air conditioning unit. Approval was given to spend up to \$4,000 from the Major Improvement fund to replace the check valve in the MPF with an automatic check valve with an added manual feature to prevent flooding. A School Kitchen Dishwasher was added to the Memorial list. The Board of Education was given authority to approve expenditures of the School Discretionary Fund toward special projects. The Board of Education was authorized to make part-time and one-year calls for the 2021-2022 school year. Eric Libby was called to teach PE, Health and other classes in the High School.
