The Pharisees heard the crowd murmuring these things concerning Him, and the Pharisees and the chief priests sent officers to take Him. 33 Then Jesus said to them, "I shall be with you a little while longer, and then I go to Him who sent Me. 34 "You will seek Me and not find Me, and where I am you cannot come." 35 Then the Jews said among themselves, "Where does He intend to go that we shall not find Him? Does He intend to go to the Dispersion among the Greeks and teach the Greeks? 36 "What is this thing that He said, You will seek Me and not find Me, and where I am you cannot come '?" 37 On the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink. 38 "He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water." 39 But this He spoke concerning the Spirit, whom those believing in Him would receive; for the Holy Spirit was not yet given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

MASK UPDATE FROM IMMANUEL DEACONS As of Friday,

SUMMARY of RECESSED QUARTERLY VOTERS' MEETING May 17, 2021

The treasurer's report showed:

- Congregation giving to Current Expenses was 99.86% which is less than \$200 shy of 100%
- Tuition is \$16,000 ahead of budget in part due to some \$20,000 in back-payment collected.
- Expenses were \$16,581.34 larger than our income.
- The General Fund balance is off to a very strong start to the year at only \$16,583 down from the beginning of the year. We are substantially ahead of the \$72,839 deficit observed in 2020.
- \$20,362 in contributions are needed over the next 3 months to meet our CLC CBP estimate.
- \$40,328.42 remains on the Gym Floor CEF loan Sanctuary Improvements were considered:
- The 2020 Sanctuary Remodeling Fund. Currently has \$5,300.

- Pew Re-Cushioning was approved with \$9,645 from the 2020 Sanctuary Remodeling Fund. When there is enough money in the fund the Committee may proceed.
- New Flooring for the Narthex Entryway and Sanctuary was approved with up to \$25,000 from the 2020 Sanctuary Remodeling Fund. Carpet squares will be put under the pews, rolled carpet in the aisles, and polyurea in the narthex and deacons' room. When there is enough money in the fund the Committee may proceed.
- Remodeling of the altar area and repositioning of the pews was tabled. Current high lumber costs and piano position need to be evaluated.

Erika Hart was called to be the Kindergarten teacher.

The meeting was adjourned.
