"You know, from the first day that I came to Asia, in what manner I always lived among you, **19** "serving the Lord with all humility, with many tears and trials which happened to me by the plotting of the Jews; **20** "how I kept back nothing that was helpful, but proclaimed it to you, and taught you publicly and from house to house, **21** "testifying to Jews, and also to Greeks, repentance toward God and faith toward our Lord Jesus Christ. **22** "And see, now I go bound in the spirit to Jerusalem, not knowing the things that will happen to me there, **23** "except that the Holy Spirit testifies in every city, saying that chains and tribulations await me. **24** "But none of these things move me; nor do I count my life dear to myself, so that I may finish my race with joy, and the ministry which I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify to the gospel of the grace of God. **25** "And indeed, now I know

that you all, among whom I have gone preaching the kingdom of God, will see my face no more. 26 "Therefore I testify to you this day that I am innocent of the blood of all men. 27 "For I have not shunned to declare to you the whole counsel of God. 28 "Therefore take heed to yourselves and to all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood. 29 "For I know this, that after my departure savage wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock. 30 "Also from among yourselves men will rise up, speaking perverse things, to draw away the disciples after themselves. 31 "Therefore watch, and remember that for three years I did not cease to warn everyone night and day with tears. 32 "So now, brethren, I commend you to God and to the word of His grace, which is able to build you up and give you an inheritance among all those who are sanctified. 33 "I have coveted no one's silver or gold or apparel. 34 "Yes, you yourselves know that these hands have provided for my necessities, and for those who were with me. 35 "I have shown you in every way, by laboring like this, that you must support the weak. And remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He said, It is more blessed to give than to receive.'"

36 And when he had said these things, he knelt down and prayed with them all. 37 Then they all wept freely, and fell on Paul's neck and kissed him, 38 sorrowing most of all for the words which he spoke, that they would see his face no more. And they accompanied him to the ship.

SERMON 2 SAMUEL 12:1-14

Then the LORD sent Nathan to David. And he came to him, and said to him: "There were two men in one city, one rich and the other poor. 2 "The rich man had exceedingly many flocks and herds. 3 "But the poor man had nothing, except one little ewe lamb which he had bought and nourished; and it grew up together with him and with his children. It ate of his own food and drank from his own cup and lay in his bosom; and it was like a daughter to him. 4 "And a traveler came to the rich man, who refused to take from his own flock and from his own herd to prepare one for the wayfaring man who had come to him; but he took the poor man's lamb and prepared it for the man who had come to him."

5 So David's anger was greatly aroused against the man, and he said to Nathan, "As the LORD lives, the man who has done this shall surely die!
6 "And he shall restore fourfold for the lamb, because he did this thing and because he had no pity." 7 Then Nathan said to David, "You are the man! Thus says the LORD God of Israel:

'I anointed you king over Israel, and I delivered you from the hand of Saul. **8** 'I gave you your master's house and your master's wives into your keeping, and gave you the house of Israel and Judah. And if that had been too little, I also would have given you much more! **9** 'Why have you despised the commandment of the LORD, to do evil in His sight? You have killed Uriah the Hittite with the sword; you have taken his wife to be your wife, and have killed him with the sword of the people of Ammon. **10** 'Now therefore, the sword shall never depart from your house, because you have despised Me, and have taken the wife of Uriah the Hittite to be your wife.' **11** "Thus says the LORD: 'Behold, I will raise up adversity against you from your own house; and I will take your wives before your eyes and give them to your neighbor, and he shall lie with your wives in the sight of this sun. **12** 'For you did it secretly, but I will do this thing before all Israel, before the sun.'"

13 So David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD." And Nathan said to David, "The LORD also has put away your sin; you shall not die. **14** "However, because by this deed you have given great occasion to the enemies of the LORD to blaspheme, the child also who is born to you shall surely die."

SIC COMMITTEE UPDATE The Sanctuary Improvement Committee is not presently pursuing any further updates to the sanctuary beyond the carpet and the pew reconditioning. We recommend giving priority to the major structural maintenance needs reported by the Property Board.

PROPERTY ANNOUNCMENT Our facility is in need of roughly

\$300,000 in repairs over the next several years:

Time line and estimate as follows:

Present-2 years Church roof \$70K

2-6 years Tuck Pointing on exterior brick \$120K

6-10 years. Placing a rubber roof on the gym \$110K

Funds from Major Improvement will go towards these projects and prioritize the need when funds become available. Thank you for the consideration.

UPCOMING CONGREGATIONAL MEETINGS

At our July 19, 2021 Voters meeting...

A letter from the Immanuel Faculty was shared with a desire to revisit the current Immanuel School Singing Policy. In particular allowing non members to join in singing for school-led worship and ministry opportunities (e.g. caroling in nursing homes, singing at graduation). A letter from Pastor Naumann was presented providing perspective on the current choir policy.

It was moved and carried at the July Voters meeting to have the Faculty, Board of Deacons, Board of Education and Pastors coordinate three open congregational meetings, prior to the next quarterly meeting, on the topic of Immanuel's student singing policy. The purpose of these meetings are to provide information, allow for conversation, and work toward alignment on the topic as the policy is planned to be revisited at the October Voters meeting.

DATES for these meetings have been set beginning on Wednesday, September 1st at 7pm (for no more than 90 mins) in the church basement.

To prepare attendees for the meetings, the following resources can be found attached: History around Immanuel School Signing Policy, Immanuel Faculty Letter, and Pastor Naumann's Letter.

Please review these resources in advance of the first meeting.

In order to encourage more open discussion, the committees decided the meetings won't be live streamed or recorded.

AGENDA for the 1st meeting will be focused on providing information and gaining shared understanding and is as follows:

- -Summary of concerns of both sides, including a brief history of this discussion at Immanuel
- -Breakout discussion with small groups, followed by larger regroup
- -Questions and comments at the end will help focus the 2nd meeting

During subsequent meetings, the focus will be diving deeper into areas of question and concern as well as working toward alignment as a congregation on the topic.
