SECOND LESSON MATTHEW 10:16-22

Congregational Welcome: ♪ Glory be to You, O Lord!

Being a follower and faithful witness to our Savior is a difficult task. His "disciples" will be hated by the world, they will be mistreated and beaten because of what they believe. This may cause us to hide or withdraw in fear or doubt. But Jesus encourages us to be strong, and to put our trust in Him. Be prepared for those encounters, knowing they will come, and knowing the joy that awaits us because we have been bought at a price!

"Behold, I send you out as sheep in the midst of wolves. Therefore be wise as serpents and harmless as doves. **17** "But beware of men, for they will deliver you up to councils and scourge you in their synagogues. **18** "You will be brought before governors and kings for My sake, as a testimony to them and to the Gentiles. **19** "But when they deliver you up, do not worry about how or what you should speak. For it will be given to you in that hour what you should speak; **20** "for it is not you who speak, but the Spirit of your Father who speaks in you. **21** "Now brother will deliver up brother to death, and a father his child; and children will rise up against parents and cause them to be put to death. **22** "And you will be hated by all for My name's sake. But he who endures to the end will be saved.

OUR CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION OF SINS

P: In keeping with the words of the Apostle in 1 Corinthians 10:16, "The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the communion of the body of Christ?"

As well as 1 Corinthians 11:27-29, which cautions us that:

"Therefore whoever eats this bread or drinks this cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner eats and drinks judgment to himself, not discerning the Lord's body."

Let us then, humbly, examine our hearts:

1. Do you confess that you are a sinner before God and deserve His wrath and punishment? - Then declare it by saying, "I do confess." C: I do confess.

2. Do you humbly seek the Lord's forgiveness, believing that God, by grace, for Jesus' sake, will forgive you all of your sins? – Then declare it by saying: "I do believe."

C: I do believe.

P: Be assured, your Father in heaven, looks upon you with mercy for Jesus' sake. His Son was wounded for your transgressions and bruised for your iniquities. As the Word of God declares:

"For God made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." (2 Cor. 5:21)

The Lord comfort your hearts. In Jesus, you are forgiven!

3. Do you in humble faith recognize that the body and blood of our Lord Jesus are truly present together with the bread and the wine in this blessed sacrament? -- Then declare it by saying: "By faith I do recognize, and believe."

C: By faith I do recognize, and believe.

4. Finally, as a forgiven child of God, do you intend, with the strength of God the Spirit, to amend your sinful life and to put away the sin that so easily entangles and leads you away from our Lord? – Then declare it by saying: "I do so intend, with the help of Christ." **C: I do so intend, with the help of Christ**.

P: Receive then this sacrament with joy, comfort, and peace!

WORDS OF INSTITUATION

Our Practice of Close Communion	Communing	
A Holy Sacrament - Holy Communion is correctly called a 'Sacrament' because it is a "Sacred act;" not in what WE do for Christ, but in what Christ does for us.	Kneeling rail - Members who have difficulty at the kneeling rail may sit in the front pew on either side. The pastors will bring communion to you there.	
 Spiritual Unity - God's Word also presents the reception of this Sacrament as a most intimate expression of spiritual and confessional unity (1 Cor. 1:10; 10:16-17; Rom. 15:5,6). Closed Communion - We ask only those who have publicly professed such oneness of faith and belief with us by membership here or another CLC church to come forward for Communion at this time. This is not a judgment of anyone's faith, but rather an expression of ours (Rom. 16:17-18). Visitors - If there are visitors present who wish to commune with us in the future, you are invited to speak with the Pastor about this at your convenience. We'd love to have you! 	there. Balcony - Any communicants sitting in the balcony should please come down to the narthex for direction to the table. Direction - Communicants are ushered to the communion table. If you desire the bread in your hand, simply extend your hand to the Pastor as he approaches you with the bread. Those desiring an individual cup, please take a cup when the tray is offered. The common cup will follow. Gluten Free / Non-alcoholic grape wine - Communicants can find these items on the way up to the Lord's Table. Dispose cup - Please dispose of your individual cup in the baskets located on each side or in the center aisle.
