



OUR LORD SPEAKS TO US

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON 1 KINGS 19:1-18

And Ahab told Jezebel all that Elijah had done, also how he had executed all the prophets with the sword. 2 Then Jezebel sent a messenger to Elijah, saying, "So let the gods do to me, and more also, if I do not make your life as the life of one of them by tomorrow about this time."3 And when he saw that, he arose and ran for his life, and went to Beersheba, which belongs to Judah, and left his servant there. 4 But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a broom tree. And he prayed that he might die, and said, "It is enough! Now, LORD, take my life, for I am no better than my fathers!" 5 Then as he lay and slept under a broom tree, suddenly an angel touched him, and said to him, "Arise and eat." 6 Then he looked, and there by his head was a cake baked on coals, and a jar of water. So he ate and drank, and lay down again. 7 And the langel of the LORD came back the second time, and touched him, and said, "Arise and eat, because the journey is too great for you." **8** So he arose, and ate and drank; and he went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights as far as Horeb, the mountain of God. 9 And there he went into a cave, and spent the night in that place; and behold, the word of the LORD came to him, and He said to him, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" 10 So he said, "I have been very zealous for the LORD God of hosts; for the children of Israel have forsaken Your covenant, torn down Your altars, and killed Your prophets with the sword. I alone am left; and they seek to take my life." 11 Then He said, "Go out, and stand on the mountain before the LORD." And behold, the LORD passed by, and a great and strong wind tore into the mountains and broke the rocks in pieces before the LORD, but the LORD was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake; 12 and after the earthquake a fire, but the LORD was not in the fire; and after the fire a still small voice.

13 So it was, when Elijah heard *it*, that he wrapped his face in his mantle and went out and stood in the entrance of the cave. Suddenly a voice *came* to him, and said, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" 14 And he said, "I have been very zealous for the LORD God of hosts; because the children of Israel have forsaken Your covenant, torn down Your altars, and killed Your prophets with the sword. I alone am left; and they seek to take my life." 15 Then the LORD said to him: "Go, return on your way to the

Wilderness of Damascus; and when you arrive, anoint Hazael as king over Syria. **16** Also you shall anoint Jehu the son of Nimshi as king over Israel. And Elisha the son of Shaphat of Abel Meholah you shall anoint as prophet in your place. **17** It shall be that whoever escapes the sword of Hazael, Jehu will kill; and whoever escapes the sword of Jehu, Elisha will kill. **18** Yet I have reserved seven thousand in Israel, all whose knees have not bowed to Baal, and every mouth that has not kissed him."

GOSPEL LESSON MATTHEW 12:1-13

Congregational Welcome: ♪ Glory be to You, O Lord!

At that time Jesus went through the grainfields on the Sabbath. And His disciples were hungry, and began to pluck heads of grain and to eat. 2 And when the Pharisees saw it, they said to Him, "Look, Your disciples are doing what is not lawful to do on the Sabbath!" 3 But He said to them, "Have you not read what David did when he was hungry, he and those who were with him: 4 how he entered the house of God and ate the showbread which was not lawful for him to eat, nor for those who were with him, but only for the priests? 5 Or have you not read in the law that on the Sabbath the priests in the temple profane the Sabbath, and are blameless? 6 Yet I say to you that in this place there is One greater than the temple. 7 But if you had known what this means, 'I desire mercy and not sacrifice,' you would not have condemned the guiltless. 8 For the Son of Man is Lord even of the Sabbath." 9 Now when He had departed from there, He went into their synagogue. 10 And behold, there was a man who had a withered hand. And they asked Him, saying, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath?"-that they might accuse Him. 11 Then He said to them, "What man is there among you who has one sheep, and if it falls into a pit on the Sabbath, will not lay hold of it and lift it out? 12 Of how much more value then is a man than a sheep? Therefore it is lawful to do good on the Sabbath." 13 Then He said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." And he stretched it out, and it was restored as whole as the other.

SERMON TITUS 1:1-9

- Paul, a bondservant of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ, according to the faith of God's elect and the acknowledgment of the truth which accords with godliness, **2** in hope of eternal life which God, who cannot lie, promised before time began, **3** but has in due time manifested His word through preaching, which was committed to me according to the commandment of God our Savior; **4** To Titus, a true son in our common faith: Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ our Savior.
- 5 For this reason I left you in Crete, that you should set in order the things that are lacking, and appoint elders in every city as I commanded you-- 6 if a man is blameless, the husband of one wife, having faithful children not accused of dissipation or insubordination.
 7 For a bishop must be blameless, as a steward of God, not self-willed, not quick-tempered, not given to wine, not violent, not greedy for money, 8 but hospitable, a lover of what is good, sober-minded, just, holy, self-controlled, 9 holding fast the faithful word as he has been taught, that he may be able, by sound doctrine, both to exhort and convict those who contradict.

Immanuel Charter for Expansion Relocation Committee (ERC)

Updated: September 7, 2021 (at our regular meeting)

Origin: An Expansion Relocation Committee (ERC) was first established in 2005 to compile a list of our needs to function as a church and school, including consideration of pros and cons of relocating, and to guide the expansion/relocation process. Over the years, different committees with similar

names have performed various functions at the behest of the voters. This charter is to clarify the purpose and organization of the current ERC in order to best serve the congregation going forward as new committee members join the committee.

Purpose: The purpose of the ERC is to facilitate the expansion of the ministry of Immanuel through the relocation of different aspects of the ministry in a fiscally responsible way.

Membership: The members of the ERC shall be appointed by the president of the congregation. The committee shall consist of five voters, two at large members (not necessarily voters), and one full-time school faculty member. The pastors may serve in an advisory role to this committee.

Meeting Time/Location: The time, day and location of the regular meetings will be set by a majority vote of all the committee members. This vote may be conducted through email provided all responses are received and the results communicated by email prior to 24 hours before the next regular monthly meeting. The location of the meeting may be adjusted as necessary with proper communication of the new location (i.e. note on the door). Special meetings may be called by the chairman when necessary. A committee member may petition the chairman with a request for a special meeting which the chairman may grant at his discretion. Effort should be given to have special meetings at a date and time in which a majority of members are able to attend.

Activities, Duties, and Responsibilities: The ERC has been directed by the voters to:

- 1. Identify phases for relocation and establish specific goals for a stepped approach to move the church and school into a new facility.
- 2. Establish financial guidelines with the finance committee for responsible relocation.
- 3. Develop the criteria for new land purchase.
- 4. Recommend suitable property for the possible relocation of Immanuel.
- 5. Effectively communicate with the various congregational boards when topics of discussion would fall under the purview of a specific board (i.e. financial considerations for relocation should be done in conjunction with the finance board, staffing considerations should be done in conjunction with the board of education).

Question for the Voters:

As identified above, are we still interested in expanding our ministry by seeking out future property that would address these needs:

Parking, Multiple Level, Preschool, Facility Congestion, Security, Storage, Green Space, Maintenance & Operational Costs, Location
