The Sermon - Luke 2:1-14

1 And it came to pass in those days that a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. 2 This census first took place while Quirinius was governing Syria. 3 So all went to be registered, everyone to his own city. 4 Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, 5 to be registered with Mary, his betrothed wife, who was with child. 6 So it was, that while they were there, the days were completed for her to be delivered. 7 And she brought forth her firstborn Son, and wrapped Him in

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Luther Writes about Our Riches in Christ

Over the fields of Bethlehem, the angel announced to the shepherds: "I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." (Luke 2:10-11). No one can ever fully expound these words. They are a heavenly message. We may sing of them, to be sure; but we shall never exhaust their meaning. This, says the angel is to be your joy. If we had all the joy of the world, what would it be? Madam Disgust! For when we consider the end of all joys, we find a common seal at the end of all, namely, disgust. After you have lived a life of glory and pleasure, what is the end? Disgust, as Solomon says "Even in laughter the heart is sorrowful; and the end of mirth is heaviness." (Prov. 14:13). The end of worldly pleasure is grief. After money has been your delight for a long time, there comes the grief of thinking how you are to hold on to it. For the joy of the world rests only on uncertain, temporal possessions, honor, and pleasure. It cannot last any longer than these but vanishes and disappears if only an evil wind blows upon it and it must suffer a little trouble. But the joy of the Christian endures forever, because its foundation stands forever. It remains firm and increases in the midst of external sorrow and misfortune. Therefore a believer is able to forego and despise all the joy of the world with a cheerful heart.
