SERMON EXODUS 14:21-31

Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea; and the LORD caused the sea to go back by a strong east wind all that night, and made the sea into dry land, and the waters were divided. **22** So the children of Israel went into the midst of the sea on the dry ground, and the waters were a wall to them on their right hand and on their left. **23** And the Egyptians pursued and went after them into the midst of the sea, all Pharaoh's horses, his chariots, and his horsemen. **24** Now it came to pass, in the

morning watch, that the LORD looked down upon the army of the Egyptians through the pillar of fire and cloud, and He troubled the army of the Egyptians. **25** And He took off their chariot wheels, so that they drove them with difficulty; and the Egyptians said, "Let us flee from the face of Israel, for the LORD fights for them against the Egyptians." **26** Then the LORD said to Moses, "Stretch out your hand over the sea, that the waters may come back upon the Egyptians, on their chariots, and on their horsemen." **27** And Moses stretched out his hand over the sea; and when the morning appeared, the sea returned to its full depth, while the Egyptians were fleeing into it. SYNOD ANNOUNCEMENTS

2022 CLC MISSION HELPERS TO ZAMBIA Eight CLC Mission Helpers (Kaylee Koenig, Kari Wales, Erica Oster, Andrea D'Onofrio, Amy Tvedt, Candy Ohlmann, Henry Lau, and Noah Ohlmann) along with Missionary Ohlmann will depart on an evening flight from Chicago on Monday (7/11) on their way to Zambia. When they arrive in Lusaka, Zambia they will be met by Pastor Ibrahim Lyimo of the Zambia-CLC. The Mission Helpers will divide into two teams as they spend the next few weeks proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ to an estimated 3,000 children. They will focus their efforts on towns and villages where the Z-CLC has been or is working to establish congregations and preaching stations in and around Lusaka and Livingstone. 2022 Convention Summary

The 35th Convention of the Church of the Lutheran Confession was held at Immanuel Lutheran College, Eau Claire, WI on June 23-26, 2022. The theme of the Convention was “The Light of the World.” A full report from the Convention will be published in the *Proceedings* during the coming weeks.

Doctrine

Concerning the “Report from the CLC Board of Doctrine and the Joint Committee Representatives, on Church Fellowship and Its Termination”

RESOLVED that we ask the 2023 CLC General Pastoral Conference to study Part One of the “Report from the CLC Board of Doctrine and the Joint Committee Representatives, on Church Fellowship and Its Termination,” as well as “What Scripture Teaches Regarding Admonition and Termination of Fellowship,” and be it further

RESOLVED that we pray that the Lord would bless the CLC General Pastoral Conference’s study and the synod’s study of both documents. We also request that the results of the CLC General Pastoral Conference’s study be reported to the 2024 convention.

Whereas the 2021 Convention directed “that the four-man CLC committee, in conjunction with the CLC Board of Doctrine, clearly define what is necessary for a settlement of the doctrinal difference between the CLC and the WELS and ELS concerning the termination of fellowship” ; and

Whereas they have “identified three areas which, if agreed upon by our respective church bodies, would demonstrate that we are, in fact, in genuine agreement on this doctrine” (2022 Prospectus pp. 29-31); and

Whereas we agree that these three points are necessary for genuine agreement on this doctrine; and

Whereas there are a number of views among us regarding if and how talks with the WELS/ELS should continue, but these differences do not constitute a difference in doctrine among us; and

Whereas we do not believe that our ongoing talks thus far have been inconsistent with Scripture’s clear warnings concerning false teachers; and

Whereas we should be mindful of God’s warning about false teachers and causing spiritual offense, as well as God’s exhortation to be ready “by sound doctrine, both to exhort and convict those who contradict”; and

Whereas we all by the Spirit’s power should strive to “keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.” Therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the CLC president, in conjunction with the Joint

Committee and the Board of Doctrine, bring the three points outlined on page 30 of the *Prospectus* to the WELS and ELS to see if they are willing to accept them.

1. All three church bodies must clearly state their agreement on what Scripture teaches in Romans 16:17-18 concerning the termination of fellowship with false teachers. / 2. It is necessary that the WELS and ELS reject past official, synodical statements on this subject which disagree with the doctrine of Scripture. / 3. It is necessary that current official synodical statements that conflict with the doctrine of Scripture are removed or corrected, not merely annotated in online format. (*Prospectus*, p. 30)

RESOLVED that if they are not willing to accept them, we direct that the current formal inter-synodical discussions cease.

This is our response to the memorial from Prince of Peace, Hecla, SD.

Missions

RESOLVED that the Board of Missions modify their guidelines to correspond with the 2021 convention directive to encourage domestic subsidized congregations to open Christian day schools when feasible.

Memorial to Create a New Board of Education

RESOLVED that a Committee for Domestic Christian Day Schools, to serve under the supervision of the Board of Education and Publications (BoEP), be appointed by the CLC President to assist the BoEP in the work of exploring and developing a new program for the establishment of new Christian Day Schools along with encouragement and further support and development of already established Christian Day Schools who request assistance in their work, and be it further

RESOLVED that we establish a Fund for Christian Education to be administered by the CLC Board of Trustees at the direction of the BoEP and for the purpose of assisting CLC congregations in the establishment and ongoing support of Christian Day Schools, and be it further

RESOLVED that the BoEP brings a proposal for continued implementation and ongoing funding of a program to establish new Christian Day Schools and provide support and encouragement to already established schools requesting assistance to the 2024 CLC Convention for consideration and approval.

Immanuel Lutheran College (ILC)

RESOLVED that we encourage the Board of Regents to research and complete [improving the WiFi on campus] using their existing resources.

RESOLVED that we approve the Immanuel Lutheran College Planning Committee design concept and plan to construct a new gymnasium

and Center for Fine Arts building.

RESOLVED that the CLC president appoint a building committee and a publicity committee, and be it also

RESOLVED that we direct the building committee, in coordination with the contractor, to begin construction when the needed funds to complete the project have been secured.

RESOLVED that we approve a three million dollar 30-year loan from the CEF at 2.5% interest rate to be used in conjunction with the ILC Building Fund for funding of the project.

RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees study the feasibility and potential value of the sale of the ILC campus parcel south of Lowes Creek, including ways of ensuring that any future developments on that parcel would not interfere with the use of the remaining campus, and be it further

RESOLVED that the COLA adjustment for code salary compensation be set at 8% for FY23.

RESOLVED that the CLC Foundation and its Endowment be dissolved.

RESOLVED that the remaning balance of the Foundation Endowment (approximately \$3600) be applied to the General Fund Endowment.

Subsequent Convention action moved \$15,000 of the \$19,000 in the CLC Foundation to the CLC General Fund and \$4,000 to the newly created Education Fund.

RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees report to the 2024 Convention on a timetable for achieving the new target base in compensation.

Budgeting Process

RESOLVED that the 2006 CLC Convention Budgeting Proposal be eliminated.

Standing Constitution Committee Report

RESOLVED that when doctrinal discussions with another church group are being planned, or even if they have begun, the president or convention has the option of requesting the Board of Doctrine's involvement, but it would not be required, and be it further

RESOLVED that we direct the Standing Constitution Committee to draft

language to amend the constitution to reflect the above resolution and present it to the 2024 CLC Convention, and be it further

RESOLVED that we encourage the President to seek input from the Board of Doctrine in doctrinal discussions with other church groups.

Conference Visitors -- The Convention ratified the Conference Visitors as elected by their respective conferences: **Great Lakes:** Pastor Andrew Schaller; **Minnesota:** Pastor James Albrecht; **Pacific Coast:** Pastor David Naumann; **West Central:** Pastor Michael Roehl; **South Eastern:** Pastor Matthew Hanel.

Membership: Pastor-Elect Zachary Sippert, Pastor Luke Willitz, Teacher Benjamin Hanel, and Teacher Kevin Schrader were accepted as voting members of the Church of the Lutheran Confession.

Elections — The following were re-elected, **President:** Pastor Michael Eichstadt, **Vice-President:** Pastor Michael Wilke, **Moderator:** Pastor Paul Nolting, **Secretary:** Pastor Wayne Eichstadt (officers are all elected to two-year terms). **Board of Trustees:** Professor Jeff Schierenbeck, Mr. Tom Lentz, **Board of Regents:** Pastor John Hein, Mr. James Burkhardt, **Board of Missions:** Pastor Nathanael Mayhew, Mr. Joel Krafft, **Board of Education and Publications:** Pastor David Naumann, Professor Ross Roehl (board members are all elected to four-year terms).

Appointments for periodical editors were ratified: Professor Paul Naumann (*Lutheran Spokesman*), Pastor Wayne Eichstadt (*Journal of Theology*), Pastor Nathan Pfeiffer (*Ministry by Mail*); Pastor David Pfeiffer (*Daily Rest*); and Pastor Glenn Oster (CLC Webmaster).
