

OLD TESTAMENT READING LEVITICUS 17:10-14

Blood = life. God forbid that His Old Testament people eat blood, and gave a strong punishment to those who did. They were "cut off from among his people." The sacrifices of the Old Testament pointed ahead to the fact that the blood of Jesus would be required to atone for the sin of the world. His life would be demanded as the price in our place. It would be poured on the altar of the cross to secure our redemption.

`And whatever man of the house of Israel, or of the strangers who dwell among you, who eats any blood, I will set My face against that person who eats blood, and will cut him off from among his people. **11** `For the life of the flesh is in the blood, and I have given it to you upon the altar to make atonement for your souls; for it is the blood that makes atonement for the soul.' **12** "Therefore I said to the children of Israel, `No one among you shall eat blood, nor shall any stranger who dwells among you eat blood.' **13** "Whatever man of the children of Israel, or of the strangers who dwell among you, who hunts and catches any animal or bird that may be eaten, he shall pour out its blood and cover it with dust; **14** "for it is the life of all flesh. Its blood sustains its life. Therefore I said to the children of Israel, `You shall not eat the blood of any flesh, for the life of all flesh is its blood. Whoever eats it shall be cut off.'

GOSPEL READING LUKE 2:25-35

Congregational Welcome: 🔓 Glory be to You, O Lord!

Luke records the reaction of Simeon when the baby Jesus is brought into the temple by Mary and Joseph. The Holy Spirit had revealed to Simeon who this baby was and when he saw the baby he took Him in His arms and praised the LORD saying: "Let me depart in peace... for my eyes have seen your salvation." We sing this at the end of our communion distribution. In communion, our lips have touched the body of our Savior and our eyes have seen His salvation as we receive the forgiveness of our sins in the Sacrament. We pray: "Let us depart in peace" with the assurance of life and salvation.

And behold, there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon, and this man was just and devout, waiting for the Consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. 26 And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. 27 So he came by the Spirit into the temple. And when the parents brought in the Child Jesus, to do for Him according to the custom of the law, 28 he took Him up in his arms and blessed God and said: 29 "Lord, now You are letting Your servant depart in peace, According to Your word; 30 For my eyes have seen Your salvation 31 Which You have prepared before the face of all peoples, 32 A light to bring revelation to the Gentiles, And the glory of Your people Israel." 33 And Joseph and His mother marveled at those things which were spoken of Him. 34 Then Simeon blessed them, and said to Mary His mother, "Behold, this Child is destined for the fall and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign which will be spoken against 35 "(yes, a sword will pierce through your own soul also), that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed."

SERMON TEXT 1 CORINTHIANS 11:23-32

For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you: that the Lord Jesus on the same night in which He was betrayed took bread; **24** and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, "Take, eat; this is My body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me." **25** In the same manner He also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me." **26** For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till He comes.

27 Therefore whoever eats this bread or drinks this cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord.
28 But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup. 29 For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner eats and drinks judgment to himself, not discerning the Lord's body. 30 For this reason many are weak and sick among you, and many sleep. 31 For if we would judge ourselves, we would not be judged. 32 But when we are judged, we are chastened by the Lord, that we may not be condemned with the world.





CLC Financial Report - August

General Fund – August offerings were **\$80,855** (incl \$400 special) **VS** disbursements of **\$86,348**. August offerings fell short of actual expenses by \$6,093, but were \$26,600 short of average monthly budget needs of \$106,600. The General Fund budget is funded by our "Cooperative Budget Plan" (CBP) offerings to subsidize the work of the Boards of Missions, Trustees, EdPub, & Regents. These are therefore sometimes also referred to as "CLC Mission offerings."

CLC Reserve Fund (above) is invested in int/div-bearing accounts until needed, typically each fiscal yearend. The YTD <u>negative</u> amount for August reflects the negative market effect on the portfolio on August 31, but market fluctuations can also be <u>positive</u> on the portfolio at the end of any month.

ILC Operations – August revenue **\$252,110** (including \$63,810 monthly General Fund subsidy) **VS** disbursements of **\$123,303**. The <u>ILC</u> Operating budget recovered from the July –\$58,800 shortfall with August student revenues of \$187,140, including several student accounts paid for the whole semester.

IIF - August receipts: \$2,898 (\$2,453/mo bequest) VS \$656 disbursed. FY23 Div/Int: \$639.

ILC Bldg - August receipts: \$4,228 (\$2,453/mo bequest) VS disb :\$12,721. FY23 Div/Int: \$8,119.

CEF –August receipts: **\$69,343** loan repayments & \$90 gift **VS** disbursed: **\$47,444**, including \$43,474 CEF Debt service on Promissory Notes). <u>FY23 Div/Int</u>: \$11,960.

MDF – August receipts: **\$16,423 VS** disbursed **\$16,070** (\$10,000 Bikes/Motorcycles; \$1,115 Africa outreach; \$2,887 PT Missionaries; \$1,570 admin & Board visitations.

SAF – August receipts: **\$7,229** (\$3,053 loan repayments; \$4,175 special gifts) **VS** disb **\$19,174** STU grants, loans, scholarships. <u>FY23 Div/Int</u>: <u>SAF</u>: **\$8,072**; <u>PMP Fund</u>: **\$9,768**; <u>Scholarship Fund</u>: **\$645**.

Kinship – August receipts: **\$9,021**: (\$4,972 offerings, \$7,090 sponsors) VS disbursed: **\$11,985**: (\$10,000 Disaster Relief; \$180 Sem student sponsorships; \$242 widow support).

** Positive & negative fluctuations in the chart <u>revenue</u> column above for the ILC Building Projects, IIF, CEF, SAF, & Reserve Fund reflect gains & losses in portfolio values from market fluctuations each month, up & down.
