PASTOR: What is the purpose of a mission festival? What is the mission of our church? Today's service is a happy occasion! We are again reminded that it is our joy the Savior has called us and has sent us as His witnesses to ALL, to share His Gospel of love!

PASTOR: Upon this confession of your sins, by the promise and authority of Christ our Savior, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

ALL: (spoken) Amen!

1st Scripture Lesson ~ Isaiah 2:1-4

The word that Isaiah the son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. 2 Now it shall come to pass in the latter days That the mountain of the Lord's house Shall be established on the top of the mountains, And shall be exalted above the hills; And all nations shall flow to it. 3 Many people shall come and say, "Come, and let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, To the house of the God of Jacob; He will teach us His ways, And we shall walk in His paths." For out of Zion shall go forth the law, And the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. 4 He shall judge between the nations, And rebuke many people; They shall beat their swords into plowshares, And their spears into pruning hooks; Nation shall not lift up sword against nation, Neither shall they learn war anymore.

2ND SCRIPTURE LESSON ~ RESPONSIVE READING OF ROMANS 10:11-17

P: For the Scripture says,

C: "Whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame."

P: For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek,

C: For the same Lord over all is rich to all who call upon Him.

P: For "whoever calls on the name of the Lord...

C: Shall be saved."

P: How then shall they call on Him...

C: In whom they have not believed?

P: And how shall they believe in Him...

C: of whom they have not heard?

P: And how shall they hear...

C: without a preacher?

P: And how shall they preach...

C: unless they are sent?

P: As it is written: "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the gospel of peace,

C: Who bring glad tidings of good things!"

P: But they have not all obeyed the gospel.

C: For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed our report?"

P: So then faith comes by hearing,

C: and hearing by the word of God.

3rd Scripture Lesson ~ Luke 24:44-53

Then He said to them, "These are the words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things must be fulfilled which were written in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms concerning Me." **45** And He opened their understanding, that they might comprehend the Scriptures.

- 46 Then He said to them, "Thus it is written, and thus it was necessary for the Christ to suffer and to rise from the dead the third day, 47 and that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in His name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. 48 And you are witnesses of these things. 49 Behold, I send the Promise of My Father upon you; but tarry in the city of Jerusalem until you are endued with power from on high."
- **50** And He led them out as far as Bethany, and He lifted up His hands and blessed them. **51** Now it came to pass, while He blessed them, that He was parted from them and carried up into heaven. **52** And they worshiped Him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy, **53** and were continually in the temple praising and blessing God. Amen.

OUR CONFESSION OF FAITH ~ LUTHER'S EXPLANATION TO 3RD ARTICLE

I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him. In this Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all sins to me and all believers. On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead and give to me and all believers in Christ eternal life.


Immanuel Budget/Offerings: \$732,990 (Jan-Dec)



Immanuel CLC Budget/Offerings: \$47,530 (July-June)





Immanuel Budget to Offerings Expected


