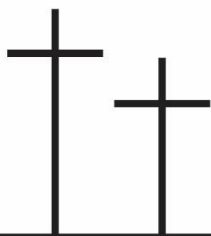

SUMMARY of QUARTERLY VOTERS' MEETING July 17, 2023

In membership matters, Joe Furst was accepted into voting membership. Robert Timm asked to be removed from the voter list. Leah Hagen, Logan and Kayla Wendt were released per their requests. Orrin and Dani Hanel were transferred to Messiah of Eau Clair, WI. Dale Redlin was transferred to Berea of

Inver Grove Heights, MN. The confirmation class of 2023 (Heidi Dick, Alexandria Kirksey, Madeline Libby, Wyatt Lien, Benjamin Miller, Coltin Olmanson, Edward Reyes, Raymond Strand), Kenzie Brucker, and Kira Brucker were accepted into communicant membership.

The Board of Education reported that Erin Radichel has accepted the teacher aide call. Colleen Kranz accepted the music teaching calls. Deidre Macias was called to fill a teacher aide position. Brandan Heinze was appointed as principal for another three years. Matthew Kranz was appointed Assistant Principal for this coming year. Marie Casto was appointed athletic director for next year. The Board approved parental leave for Kevin Schrader. The Board has agreed to allow Mankato Christian Academy to co-op with us for fall sports (Volleyball and Soccer). The State of Minnesota passed legislation to provide free lunches and breakfast to students, the lunch program will now offer breakfast through this legislation.

The Board of Property reported that the janitor will be continuing. The gym will be waxed on the August 6. The Church pews will be looked at by the company that redid the cushions (the seat appears pulling away from backs). The back stairway railing needs to be reattached. The Church roof work will be done July 26-28, the cost should be covered by insurance. The school roof will begin soon. Work sessions are planned for July 22 and 29 to work on before school items. The Board is working on a list of five year time frame projects.

The Treasurer's Report showed a Total Fund Balance/Equity of -\$105,433 at the end of June. The Mission (CLC CBP) July-June giving goal was \$52,000 and at end of June we had met our goal with \$59,509.68. Plate Offering to the General Fund (Current Expenses) was \$291,379.92 against a budget of \$314,044.38. General fund income less expense at the end of June was -\$137,707.16, the budget was for -\$142,688.32. The MPF Gym Floor Project fund was closed the surplus and any additional contributions were moved to the Major Improvement. The Financial Secretary report that church offering envelopes will be ordered next month. Plans are being formed to restart counting teams. The School Choir Policy committee reported and there was discussion. Up to \$9,000 was approved to replace the school kitchen freezer from Undesignated Memorials. A Committee of the Congregation was established to study scriptural principals relating to the school choir policy. The meeting was adjourned.
