

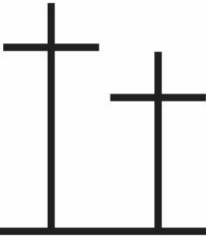

HOLY WEEK Today we enter what is called "Holy Week" by the Christian Church. This week commemorates the events of the final week of Jesus' earthly ministry. It was given the name "Holy Week" because through the holy, sinless life of Jesus and His sacrificial death on the cross, Jesus won

salvation for sinful mankind. Holy Week recounts the conclusion to the greatest, most important, historical event in the world's history. ***"You were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold... but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot"*** (1 Peter 1:18-19).

If you count all the pages in the four Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John), over one fourth record the events of this one week in the life of Jesus. This shows how important these events are, both for Jesus, and for us still today. They point us to the immense cost of Jesus' victory for sinners.

Three of the most important events come in a four-day span that we are about to enter: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Resurrection Sunday.

On Maundy Thursday the disciples prepared to celebrate the Passover meal, which was a celebration of Israel's deliverance from bondage in Egypt centuries ago. That evening, as Jesus taught His disciples, He took bread and wine from the Passover meal and instituted what we call "The Lord's Supper" or Holy Communion.

On Good Friday, Jesus was turned over to the Roman Governor, Pontius Pilate, who knew that Jesus was innocent, but condemned Him to death by crucifixion because He was afraid the Jews would revolt. Jesus died the death that sinners deserve on Good Friday. He suffered the agony of hell, forsaken by God, as our substitute. After His death, His body was taken and placed in a nearby tomb.

On Resurrection Sunday, Jesus rose victoriously from the dead and showed Himself alive to many of His followers over the next forty days. Jesus' resurrection proves that He has defeated death once and for all and has opened the door to heaven for those who trust in Him. This had all been prophesied by the prophets of the Old Testament. Everything that Jesus did was in fulfillment of God's promises made centuries earlier.

What does Holy Week mean for us today? The Apostle Paul described the meaning of Christ's work for sinners in this way: ***"For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life. And not only that, but we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received the reconciliation"*** (Romans 5:10-11).

HOLY WEEK SERVICE INFO Our worship service this morning is just the beginning of several special services which will focus our attention on the events of that climactic week and the meaning of those events for us still 2,000 years later. We invite you to join us for these special services as we consider the great cost of His victory over sin and its punishment for us!

- *“Go to dark Gethsemane...” (TLH 159:1)* - On Thursday (2:00 and 6:00pm) we will continue our Lenten meditation on the Sounds of the Passion and reflect on the sound of the splash of water by Pilate as he washed his hands of Jesus’ death sentence. We will also celebrate the Lord’s Supper during our services. (Communicants please indicate your desire to celebrate the Lord’s Supper by signing the communion registers in the church entries.)
- *“Calvary’s mournful mountain climb...” (TLH 159:3)* - On Friday we will hold a special tenebrae worship service at 2:00 and 6:00pm. This will bring our Lenten meditation on the Sounds of the Passion to a conclusion with the sound of Jesus’ cry of victory for every sinner. The service will conclude with a series of readings as the church is darkened and we reflect on the darkness of sin and its punishment which Jesus endured for us.
- *“Early hasten to the tomb...” (TLH 159:4)* - Holy Week will come to a joyful conclusion next weekend as we celebrate Jesus’ triumphant victory over death and sin with two special Resurrection celebrations. Join us for a sunrise service at 7:00am, or for the service Saturday night at 6:00pm or Sunday morning at 10:00am. There will be no Sunday School or Bible Class next weekend, but we invite you to join us for a fellowship breakfast between the 7am and 10am services.

May our Savior, who was crucified for us, bless our meditation on His work for us during this Holy Week!

General Fund and ILC Operations – The combined balance of these two operating funds is down about \$62,000 compared to the same time one year ago. Contributions to and disbursements from the General Fund are well below budget for the first nine months of our fiscal year. For ILC Operations, the revenue is ahead of budget with disbursements less than the pro-rated budget.

ILC Building Projects – Year-to-date contributions have been about \$240,000. The remaining year-to-date revenue of around \$112,000 is from increases in the market value of the investments in this fund.

Church Extension Fund – Year to date revenue consists of payments received of about \$222,000 from congregations on the loans they owe the CLC, just over \$186,000 of increases in the market value of the investments and just over \$1,000 of contributions to the fund.

EduK8 Fund – The fund had its first disbursement (\$3,500) to assist one of our Christian Day Schools.

Other Auxiliary Funds – The activity in the other funds in the table above is similar to the activity in the same period a year ago.
