SERVICE OF THE WORD

Opening Reading

Now when evening had come, because it was the Preparation Day, that is, the day before the Sabbath, 43 Joseph of Arimathea, a prominent council member, who was himself waiting for the kingdom of God, coming and taking courage, went in to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. 44 Pilate marveled that He was already dead; and summoning the centurion, he asked him if He had been dead for some time. 45 So when he found out from the centurion, he granted the body to Joseph. 46 Then he bought fine linen, took Him down, and wrapped Him in the linen. And he laid Him in a tomb which had been hewn out of the rock, and rolled a stone against the door of the tomb. 47 And Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joses observed where He was laid. (Mark 15:42-47)

Now after the Sabbath, as the first day of the week began to dawn, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to see the tomb. **2** And behold, there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven, and came and rolled back the stone from the door, and sat on it. **3** His countenance was like lightning, and his clothing as white as snow. **4** And the guards shook for fear of him, and became like dead men. (Matthew 28:1-4)

Now on the first day of the week, very early in the morning, they, and certain other women with them, came to the tomb bringing the spices which they had prepared. 2 But they found the stone rolled away from the tomb. 3 Then they went in and did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. 4 And it happened, as they were greatly perplexed about this, that behold, two men stood by them in shining garments. 5 Then, as they were afraid and bowed their faces to the earth, they said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? 6 He is not here, but is risen! Remember how He spoke to you when He was still in Galilee, 7 saying, 'The Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again." 8 And they remembered His words.

Now when He rose early on the first day of the week, He appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom He had cast seven demons. 10 She went and told those who had been with Him, as they mourned and wept. 11 And when they heard that He was alive and had been seen by her, they did not believe. 12 After that, He appeared in another form to two of them as they walked and went into the country. 13 And they went and told it to the rest, but they did not believe them either. 14 Later He appeared to the eleven as they sat at the table; and He rebuked their unbelief and hardness of heart, because they did not believe those who had seen Him after He had risen. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. **21** So Jesus said to them again, "Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you." (John 20:19-21)

We Confess our Faith in the Resurrection

- P: Our Lord bore our sins in His body on the tree;
- C: But now He is risen from the grave!
- P: But what does this mean?
- C: It means that Jesus Christ is the very Son of God, for it is written: "His Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who was born of the seed of David according to the flesh, and declared to be the Son of God with power... by the resurrection from the dead."

 (Romans 1:3-4)
- P: Yes, but what certainty does the resurrection of Jesus give us?
- C: It makes us certain that our sins are forgiven, as the apostle Paul writes that Jesus "was delivered up because of our offenses, and was raised because of our justification."

 (Romans 4:25)
- P: Should we be afraid of death?
- C: No, for Jesus will raise us up from the dead just as it is written: "But now Christ is risen from the dead, and has become the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep... For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive. But each one in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, afterward those who are Christ's at His coming."

All: Oh, that my words were written! Oh, that they were inscribed in a book! That they were engraved on a rock With an iron pen and lead, forever! Forgive us, Lord Jesus, and grant us Your free and lifegiving Spirit. Amen.
- P: Rejoice, dear sinners, for your sins are forgiven through Christ Jesus. By raising Jesus from the dead, God declares to you that He has accepted the sacrifice Jesus made on the cross for your sins. The debt of sin has been paid. In the name and by the command of our risen Lord and Savior, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Go, and sin no more. Amen!
