Acts 13:1-12

Now in the church that was at Antioch there were certain prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon who was called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen who had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch, and Saul. 2 As they ministered to the Lord and fasted, the Holy Spirit said, "Now separate to Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." 3 Then, having fasted and prayed, and laid hands on them, they sent them away. 4 So, being sent out by the Holy

Spirit, they went down to Seleucia, and from there they sailed to Cyprus. 5 And when they arrived in Salamis, they preached the word of God in the synagogues of the Jews. They also had John as their assistant. 6 Now when they had gone through the island to Paphos, they found a certain sorcerer, a false prophet, a Jew whose name was Bar-Jesus, 7 who was with the proconsul, Sergius Paulus, an intelligent man. This man called for Barnabas and Saul and sought to hear the word of God. 8 But Elymas the sorcerer (for so his name is translated) withstood them, seeking to turn the proconsul away from the faith. 9 Then Saul, who also is called Paul, filled with the Holy Spirit, looked intently at him 10 and said, "O full of all deceit and all fraud, you son of the devil, you enemy of all righteousness, will you not cease perverting the straight ways of the Lord? 11 And now, indeed, the hand of the Lord is upon you, and you shall be blind, not seeing the sun for a time." And immediately a dark mist fell on him, and he went around seeking someone to lead him by the hand. 12 Then the proconsul believed, when he saw what had been done, being astonished at the teaching of the Lord.

Second Reading

Now it came to pass, when the time had come for Him to be received up, that He steadfastly set His face to go to Jerusalem, **52** and sent messengers before His face. Our Practice of Close Communion

Communing

A Holy Sacrament - Holy Communion is correctly called a 'Sacrament' because it is a "Sacred act;" not in what WE do for Christ, but in what CHRIST does for us.

Spiritual Unity - God's Word also presents the reception of this Sacrament as a most intimate expression of spiritual and confessional unity (1 Cor. 1:10; 10:16-17; Rom. 15:5,6).

Close Communion - We ask only those who have publicly professed such oneness of faith and belief with us by membership here or another CLC church to come forward for Communion at this time. This is not a judgment of anyone's faith, but rather an expression of ours (Rom. 16:17-18).

Visitors - If there are visitors present who wish to commune with us in the future, you are invited to speak with the pastor about this at your convenience. We'd love to have you! **Kneeling rail** - Members who have difficulty at the kneeling rail may sit in the front pews. The pastor will bring communion to you there.

Balcony - Any communicants sitting in the balcony should please come down to the narthex for direction to the table.

Direction - Communicants are ushered to the communion table. If you desire the bread in your hand, simply extend your hand to the pastor as he approaches you with the bread. Those desiring an individual cup, please take a cup when the tray is offered. The common cup will follow.

Gluten Free Bread / Non-alcoholic Wine - Communicants can find these items on the way up to the Lord's Table.

Cup disposal - Please dispose of your individual cup in the baskets located on each side or in the center aisle.

THE MEANING OF CHRIST'S ASCENSION This past Thursday we celebrated the ascension of Jesus. The ascension of Jesus commemorates the day when Jesus returned to the right hand of the Father after completing the work of mankind's salvation. While the ascension of Jesus is seldom celebrated in our modern world today, Immanuel has the wonderful tradition of celebrating the ascension of Jesus in a special midweek worship service. This special service helps us remember the supreme importance of Christ's ascension in the lives of Christians. So much, that it was included by the ancient Church in both the Apostles' and Nicene Creeds. We confess "He ascended into heaven" in the Apostles' Creed, and that He "ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father" in the Nicene Creed. The Apostle Paul speaks about the meaning of Jesus' ascension when he writes: "[God] raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly places, far above all principality and power and might and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this age but also in that which is to come. And He put all things under His feet, and gave Him to be head over all things to the church" (Ephesians 1:20-22).

When Christ ascended into heaven He left His church with a going away present. These gifts were not given just to the apostles, or the disciples of Jesus' day. Paul writes, "But to each one of us grace was given according to the measure of Christ's aift. Therefore He says: 'When He ascended on high, He led captivity captive, And gave gifts to men" (Ephesians 4:7-8). With these words Paul was writing to the believers in the city of Ephesus close to 30 years after Jesus ascended into heaven. Thirty years later it was still true. We are now two thousand years removed, but it is still true today. Each one of us has been given unique gifts from Christ Himself. We should remember that we do not all have the same gifts and abilities. The gifts we have are ours because the Lord has chosen to give them to us. In addition, we should not become discouraged that we do not have the gifts that others have been given. Instead, we should realize that Christ has given each of us certain gifts, and He can and will use us in the work of His kingdom. As saints, every one of us has a part to play in the work of ministry. We are equipped for this work every time we go to church, attend Bible Class and read our Bible at home. This equipment has been given to us through the words of the apostles, prophets and evangelists by the working of the Holy Spirit as a going away present from our Savior. He has given us all that we need. Thanks to our risen and ascended Savior!
