

CLC MISSION PRAYERS The last week of October, Cyclone Montha hit the east coast of India in an area where 363 CLC-India congregations and 4300 members are located. 2,000 of these members are from the impoverished and marginalized Dalit tribal colonies. Government aid was announced, but in India, such aid is distributed only by Hindu nationalist party (BJP) leaders in districts where the BJP is in the majority. Christians are routinely turned away when requesting aid, and in some cases, they are physically beaten. Local police ignore the situation and, at times, actually join in the abuse. The CLC Board of Missions has approved Kinship funding to provide immediate, life-saving humanitarian aid to CLCI members who are suffering. Please pray that the Lord will protect, provide, strengthen, and give hope to His children in India who are suffering.
