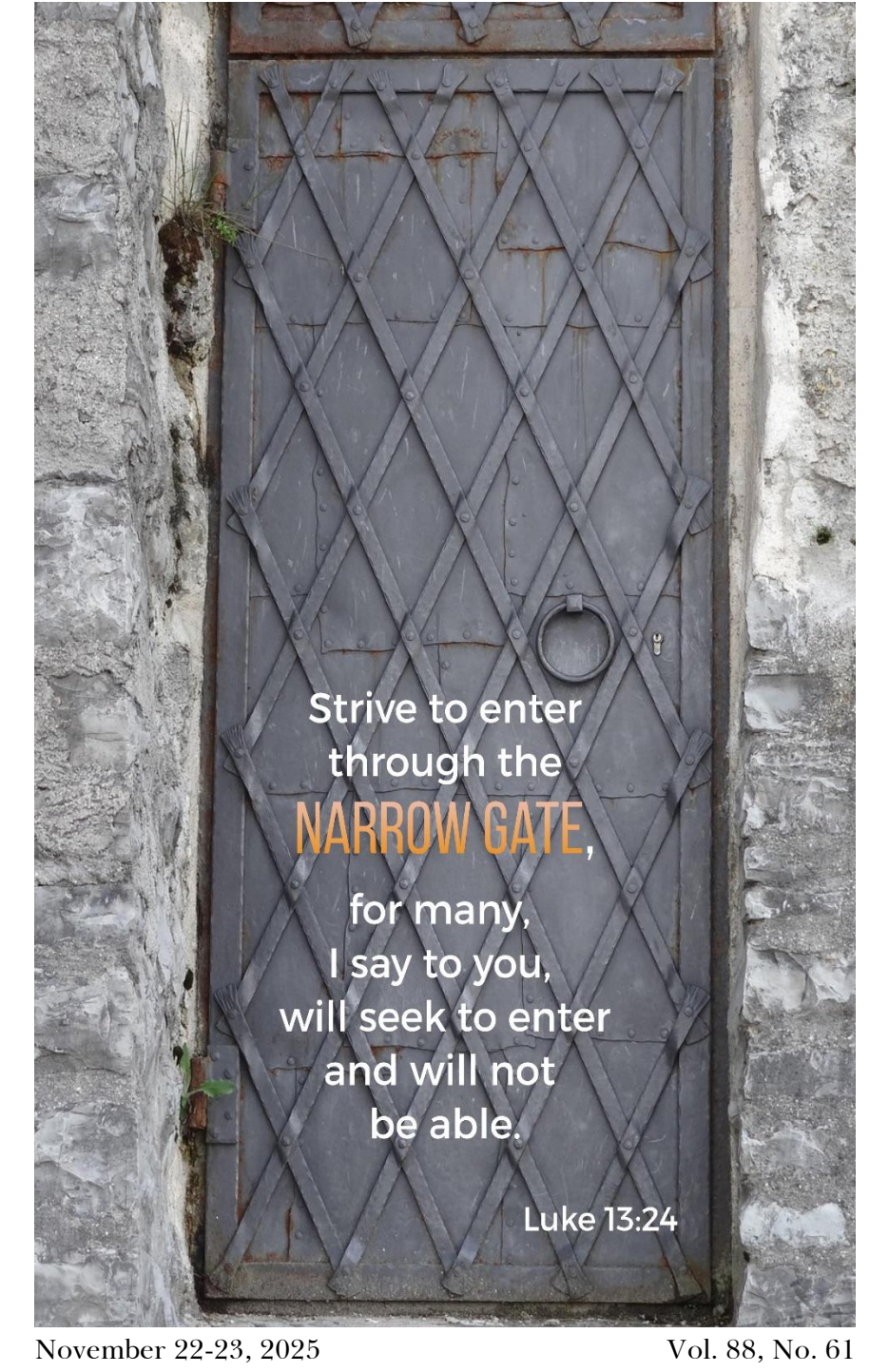
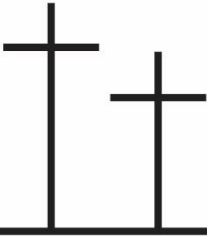

A NEW CHURCH YEAR AND ADVENT SERVICES: Today marks the last Sunday of the church year. On Wednesday / Thursday we will conclude the Trinity season with a worship service of Thanksgiving in which we will join to thank God for all the blessings He has given us in the past church year. Then, next weekend we will start a new church year with the season of Advent. The word "advent" means "coming" or "arrival", and focuses our attention on the

coming of our Savior Jesus and prepares us for the celebration of His birth on Christmas.

This year, during the season of Advent (starting next Sunday and continuing through both our midweek Advent services and the succeeding three Sunday services) we will meditate on the descriptive titles given to the promised Savior in both the Old and New Testaments. While there are many titles given to Jesus Christ in Scripture, we will focus on seven of them, found in the “Great O Antiphons” of the ancient Christian Church. Each of these seven titles teach us something about our Savior and what He has come to bring to or do for lost sinners.

Join us during this Advent season, both on Wednesday and Saturday / Sunday, to learn more about the LORD promise of a Savior for you and for all people. Here is our schedule:

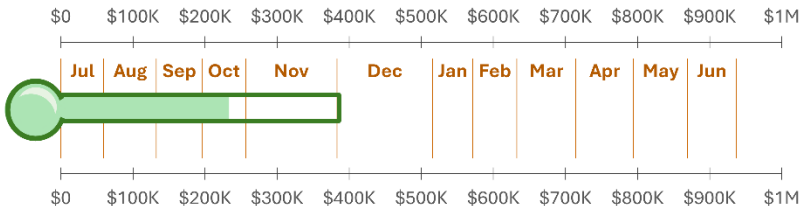

CLC MISSION PRAYERS India (South Asia) – The last week of October, Cyclone Montha hit the east coast of India in an area where 363 CLC-India congregations and 4300 members are located. 2,000 of these members are from the impoverished and marginalized Dalit tribal colonies. Government aid was announced, but it is distributed by the Hindu nationalist party (BJP) leaders in districts where the BJP is in the majority. Christians are routinely turned away when requesting aid, and in some cases, they are physically beaten. Local police ignore the situation and, at times, actually join in the abuse. You can see pictures of the devastation here: photos.app.goo.gl/pNzVTK3zCed8tMEp8. The heavy rains also led to a dam break in the BELC's Sri Kalahasti district. Please pray that the Lord will protect, provide, strengthen, and give hope to His children in India who are suffering.

The CLC Mission Helper Program, under the direction of the CLC Mission Board, is beginning to make preparations for another Mission Trip to East Africa for the summer of 2026. The exact dates have yet to be determined, but the work was determined by our Savior when He told us to go into all the world and preach the Gospel. The main focus of this trip will be presenting the Gospel, through a series of child evangelism lessons, to member and non-member children in village congregations. Possible areas of evangelism may include the CLC—Tanzania, CLC—Kenya, CLC—Zambia, and CLC-Uganda.



Listed below are a few ways you can be involved:

Pray for this effort to share the love of Christ in East Africa. Ask the Lord for guidance and to show you how you can help spread the Gospel.

Begin planning, praying, and saving so you can travel to East Africa to help share the Good News of Christ crucified.

Offer your financial support so others may participate. There is a great need for congregational support.

There are many things you will need to prayerfully consider as you think about volunteering for this trip. What follows is a short list that could be helpful in your consideration:

- The length of the trip will be 2 to 3 weeks.
- The approximate cost is \$3,500.00—\$4,000.00. This includes airfare and other expenses such as lodging, transportation, travel insurance, passports, visas etc. Vaccinations, anti-malaria meds, and other medical costs are not included in this figure.
- You must be at least 18 years of age (unless accompanied by a parent/guardian)

- Deadline for Applications is **January 18th, 2026**.
- A \$2000 payment will be due by early February.
