Our Practice of Close Communion

Communing

A Holy Sacrament - Holy Communion is correctly called a 'Sacrament' because it is a "Sacred act;" not in what WE do for Christ, but in what CHRIST does for us.

Spiritual Unity - God's Word also presents the reception of this Sacrament as a most intimate expression of spiritual and confessional unity (1 Cor. 1:10; 10:16-17; Rom. 15:5,6).

Close Communion - We ask only those who have publicly professed such oneness of faith and belief with us by membership here or another CLC church to come forward for Communion at this time. This is not a judgment of anyone's faith, but rather an expression of ours (Rom. 16:17-18).

Visitors - If there are visitors present who wish to commune with us in the future, you are invited to speak with the pastor about this at your convenience. We'd love to have you! **Kneeling rail** - Members who have difficulty at the kneeling rail may sit in the front pews. The pastor will bring communion to you there.

Balcony - Any communicants sitting in the balcony should please come down to the narthex for direction to the table.

Direction - Communicants are ushered to the communion table. If you desire the bread in your hand, simply extend your hand to the pastor as he approaches you with the bread. Those desiring an individual cup, please take a cup when the tray is offered. The common cup will follow.

Gluten Free Bread / Non-alcoholic Wine - Communicants can find these items on the way up to the Lord's Table.

Cup disposal - Please dispose of your individual cup in the baskets located on each side or in the center aisle.



THE ADVENT WREATH AND CANDLES Last week we set up an Advent wreath with five candles at the front of the church. This is not just for decoration. The Advent wreath is a valuable teaching tool which is rich in symbolism, and intended to instruct us in our worship.

The wreath is covered with evergreen. Just as this species of tree is always green, so our hope for eternity is always alive because it rests upon the living Christ. The wreath is also in the form of a circle, which has no beginning and no end, reminding us that our life with God is everlasting.

The lighted candles are symbolic of the light of Christ and His Gospel, which alone can lift us out of our sin and spiritual darkness. The four advent candles remind us of the 4000 years of waiting for Christ by the Old Testament world. The three blue candles remind us that we are in a season of reflection and repentance over our sins. The pink candle is the color for joy. Each of the four candles has a special name with special significance.

The Prophecy Candle is lit the first week in Advent. It represents the long years of waiting during which the prophets, inspired by God, kept alive the hope that the Son of God was coming to redeem His people from their sins.

The Bethlehem Candle is the 2nd candle lit. It symbolizes the preparations being made for the coming of the Christ-child. The prophecy in Micah 5:2 that foretold Jesus' birthplace at Bethlehem may seem to be a minor revelation, but it shows how God prepared even the smallest detail for the coming of Christ.

The Shepherds' Candle is the 3rd candle. It reminds us the shepherds left their task and went with haste to see the Christ-child; then they returned to joyfully tell others about the good news of the Savior. This helps us reflect on our responsibility to share the Savior and His promises with others around us.

The Angels' Candle is lit the 4th week of Advent. It reminds us of the activity of the angels before and after Jesus' birth, bearing messages, ministering, protecting, and praising God. They will also be with Jesus at His final coming on Judgment Day, to gather the nations.

The Christ Candle is the white candle in the center. This candle is lit on Christmas Eve. It signals that He Who is the Light of the world has been born according to God promise. Our Savior has come!

The light these candles put forth seems small and so does the Gospel at times. But to those in lonely darkness, it is the powerful light which shows the way to Heaven.
