Our Practice of Close Communion	Communing
<p>A Holy Sacrament - Holy Communion is correctly called a ‘Sacrament’ because it is a “Sacred act;” not in what WE do for Christ, but in what CHRIST does for us.</p> <p>Spiritual Unity - God’s Word also presents the reception of this Sacrament as a most intimate expression of spiritual and confessional unity (1 Cor. 1:10; 10:16-17; Rom. 15:5,6).</p> <p>Close Communion - We ask only those who have publicly professed such oneness of faith and belief with us by membership here or another CLC church to come forward for Communion at this time. This is not a judgment of anyone’s faith, but rather an expression of ours (Rom. 16:17-18).</p> <p>Visitors - If there are visitors present who wish to commune with us in the future, you are invited to speak with the pastor about this at your convenience. We’d love to have you!</p>	<p>Kneeling rail - Members who have difficulty at the kneeling rail may sit in the front pews. The pastor will bring communion to you there.</p> <p>Balcony - Any communicants sitting in the balcony should please come down to the narthex for direction to the table.</p> <p>Direction - Communicants are ushered to the communion table. If you desire the bread in your hand, simply extend your hand to the pastor as he approaches you with the bread. Those desiring an individual cup, please take a cup when the tray is offered. The common cup will follow.</p> <p>Gluten Free Bread / Non-alcoholic Wine - Communicants can find these items on the way up to the Lord’s Table.</p> <p>Cup disposal - Please dispose of your individual cup in the baskets located on each side or in the center aisle.</p>

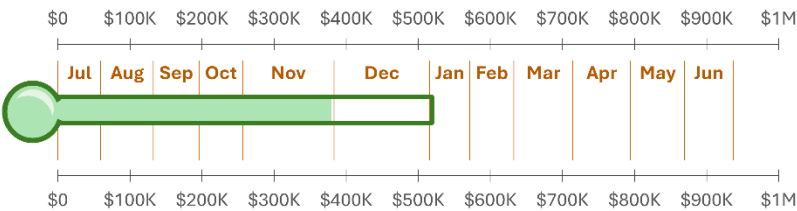

Special Meeting: Johnson Property

Monday, January 12th at 7pm

Agenda Items

- Membership Matters
- Council motions to enter into the purchase agreement for the Johnson Property.
- Council motions to authorize Expansion Relocation Committee (ERC) to handle the due diligence evaluation and contingency terms of the Johnson purchase agreement. If the terms are satisfied, the President and Secretary of the Congregation are authorized to sign the final paperwork and close on the purchase.

Summary of Motions

The first motion "*Membership Matters*" is always included on the agenda. This allows for any new voters to be added so long as they meet eligibility requirements.

The second motion is entering into the purchase agreement. The ERC, including and especially Karl Friedrichs, drafted a purchase agreement that has been signed by the seller. The purchase agreement is not being published due to an agreement to keep the sale information confidential but *any* Immanuel member may email church@immanuelmankato.org to receive a digital copy, or pick one up in the church office.

The third motion is *very* important. This gives the ERC the authority to take the steps to verify all of the contingencies (see below) are satisfied, and if they are, the congregational President (Zachary Lien) and the Secretary of the Congregation (Alan Olmanson) will then complete the remaining paperwork and close on the property.

Contingencies of the Purchase Agreement

- Financing
 - Qualify for financing
- Development Evaluation
 - Ensure zoning classifications are appropriate for our needs.
- Soil Conditions/Wetlands
 - Wetland delineation study for future building without requiring major soil preparation
- Setbacks/Impervious Surface
 - Determining that setbacks, ditches, and drainage will work with our needs
- Annexation/Subdivisions
 - Property is adjacent to City of North Mankato, but not yet annexed. ERC will evaluate the cost required for such an annexation as well as cost of subdivision plats.
- Environmental Evaluation
 - ERC may conduct a Phase I environmental assessment.
- Utilities
 - ERC may reach out to ensure utilities are accessible for any needs on the land as well as a high-voltage power line analysis.
- Assessments
 - ERC will make sure the amount of assessments on the property are accurate.
- Archeological/Historical Evaluation
 - ERC may arrange for some evaluations to verify that there's nothing preventing use of the land
- Public Access
 - ERC will reach out to local governments to guarantee sufficient walkways, roads, and highway access to the land.
