LENT SERVICES Lent begins in a little over a week, on Ash Wednesday (February 18th). This year the theme for our Midweek Lenten services will be "Assurances from Jesus' final words." In each of our midweek services we will consider one of the final statements of Jesus and reflect on the comfort those words offer us still today.
