

<p>A Holy Sacrament - Holy Communion is correctly called a ‘Sacrament’ because it is a “Sacred act;” not in what WE do for Christ, but in what CHRIST does for us.</p> <p>Spiritual Unity - God’s Word also presents the reception of this Sacrament as a most intimate expression of spiritual and confessional unity (1 Cor. 1:10; 10:16-17; Rom. 15:5,6).</p> <p>Close Communion - We ask only those who have publicly professed such oneness of faith and belief with us by membership here or another CLC church to come forward for Communion at this time. This is not a judgment of anyone’s faith, but rather an expression of ours (Rom. 16:17-18).</p> <p>Visitors - If there are visitors present who wish to commune with us in the future, you are invited to speak with the pastor about this at your convenience. We’d love to have you!</p>	<p>Kneeling rail - Members who have difficulty at the kneeling rail may sit in the front pews. The pastor will bring communion to you there.</p> <p>Balcony - Any communicants sitting in the balcony should please come down to the narthex for direction to the table.</p> <p>Direction - Communicants are ushered to the communion table. If you desire the bread in your hand, simply extend your hand to the pastor as he approaches you with the bread. Those desiring an individual cup, please take a cup when the tray is offered. The common cup will follow.</p> <p>Gluten Free Bread / Non-alcoholic Wine - Communicants can find these items on the way up to the Lord’s Table.</p> <p>Cup disposal - Please dispose of your individual cup in the baskets located on each side or in the center aisle.</p>


LENT SERVICES We are in the midst of a 40 day journey through the Lenten season. Some have a custom of giving up a certain pleasure or habit during Lent. This goes back to the examples of believers who fasted and covered themselves in sackcloth and ashes as a way of expressing repentance and sorrow over their sin before God. The custom of giving something up for Lent can serve as an aid in focusing our thoughts on Jesus and all that He gave up to purchase our redemption. If it does help in that way, it is not wrong to practice this custom. Yet there are some dangers. First of all, it can easily become a bad custom if one is led to think of this act as meriting or earning God's favor in some way. It can also lead to false pride: "I'm better than that person because I gave up..." But the whole custom of focusing on Jesus should involve us in the use of God's Word. After all, our Savior Himself tells us to **"search the**

Scriptures," for they testify of Him (John 5:39). Our giving up anything will only benefit us if we also fill up, that is use the occasion to learn of Jesus. And so our custom at Lent is to add church services which involve us in Bible study. Each Wednesday during Lent (as well as Maudy Thursday and Good Friday during Holy Week) we set aside time for worship and specific meditation on Jesus' work for us.

This year the theme for our Midweek Lenten services is "Assurances from Jesus' final words." In each of our midweek services we will consider one of the final statements of Jesus and reflect on the comfort those words offer us still today. On Wednesday Pastor Rodebaugh of Okabena

reminded us that Jesus offered a crucified criminal (and us!) confidence in eternal life, as He says: "You will be with me in Paradise." This Wednesday, Pastor Sippert from Sleepy Eye will review the words of Jesus to Mary and John, assuring us that He is also our Guardian in this life. These services will be held on Wednesdays at 2 and 6pm.

What a fine custom it is for us to give up some of our time to spend time with Jesus! May the LORD encourage you and strengthen your faith through these final words of Jesus which we study during this Lenten season.
